Duck Grapplers to Begin Home Schedule Saturday

Coach Bill Hammer's varsity and wrestling crews made final preparations today for what promises to be some of the season's strongest opposition. Inaugurating McArthur court action for 1956, the varsity meets Washington State college while the Duckling crew takes on Klamath Falls high school. The Klamath-Frosh match begins at noon and will be followed at 2 p.m. by the varsity action.

Despite the loss of three 1955 Pacific Coast intercollegiate champions, the Cougars according to Hammer, "will be strong." WSC, which meets Lewis and Clark tonight in Portland, has a comfortable nucleus of returning veterans and is strengthened by last year's strong freshman squad. Outstanding Cougar grappler, according to Hammer, is letterman 157-pounder Don Parachini. Other veteran standouts are Bob Hendricks at 137

pounds and Bill Thomas at 147.

One highlight of Saturday's varsity program will be the scheduled 123 pound match. Representing the Ducks will be Roy Schlessler, last year's P.C.I. runnerup. His Washington State opponent, Vic Eshpeter, is a sophomore beginning his first year of varsity competition. Hammer stated that Eshpeter, a former Washington state high school champion, is exceptionally strong and shows a great deal of promise.

Klamath Falls, which will face the Frosh, was third place in last year's OSAA championships. Previous to the 1955 season, Klamath had taken 11 state titles. Included among twelve returning lettermen are Richard Berg, 147-pound state champion and Dave Leling, 157-pound runnerup.

Saturday's varsity match will be the first of seven such appear-

ances in Mac court this year. All wrestling matches are open to the public, with no admission charge.
