

Symphony Gives Second Concert

The Eugene-Springfield Symphony will present the second concert of its 1955-56 season Thursday evening. The concert will be at 8 p.m. at McArthur Court.

A request that all members and friends of the Eugene-Springfield Symphony bring guests to the concert Thursday was voiced this week by Dr. Keith McMillan, chairman of the symphony board of directors.

"Members of both the symphony board and the orchestra were encouraged by the enthusiasm and increased attendance at our first concert of the season last fall," Dr. McMillan declared. "We realized after that concert that a symphony orchestra can be a success in the community."

Concert tickets will be on sale at the door. Adult admissions are \$1.50, and tickets for students of high school age and under are \$.75. University of Oregon students will be admitted free with student body cards.
