

Billiard Expert Arrives at SU

World famed billiard authority, Charlie Peterson arrived this morning for three days of instruction in the fundamentals of billiards for all interested students. He will be available for this personal instruction in the Student Union billiard area all day today, Friday and Saturday.

Peterson, referred to as the "Father of Inter-Collegiate Billiards," is on his 25th annual tour. Sponsored by the Association of College Unions, his appearance at the University of Oregon marks one of approximately 100 visits this season to leading institutions of higher learning.

This season, more than ever before, he is stressing co-ed competition. Today, from 8 to 10 p.m. and Saturday from 2 to 4 p.m. has been set as "ladies time" and instruction will be given to college women only.

Special attention will be given to the University billiards team Friday evening. Recreation manager, Louis Belisimo, urges spectators to attend.

Peterson, holder of the world's fancy shot, American Red ball and Balk-line titles, is said to be a walking encyclopedia on billiards, and knows more about the game than any other man. His entire life has been devoted to billiards playing, and he has made several movie shorts, ap-

peared in radio and television programs, and performed during the last world war on a warship.

Merrifield Addresses UO Insurance Society

State Senator John C. F. Merrifield will speak at the next meeting of the University Insurance Society, Feb. 7 at 4:30 p.m. in the Student Union. Merrifield's topic will be "Problems of Organization of New Insurance Companies."

The Insurance Society held its first meeting, for the purpose of reorganization, Tuesday afternoon. Approximately 20 students

attended. It is a chartered campus organization, but has not been active for some time. Meetings are open to anyone interested in learning more about insurance.

Officers were selected as follows: Mitch Hammerstead, president; Charles Kay, vice-president; and Gerri Sabey, secretary-treasurer. Mark Greene, associate professor of business administration, advises the organization.

Proposals were made at the first meeting to take field trips to such places as Weyerhaeuser, to investigate risks, and to promote discussions at the University by insurance men from the state.

Greene informed the meeting about two degrees which may be obtained in the insurance field. They are the C.L.U., (Chartered Liability Underwriters) offered by the American College of Life Underwriters, or the C.P.C.U., (Chartered Property and Casualty Underwriters) offered by the American Institute for Property and Liability Underwriters, Inc.
