It's Smart Woman Who Does Most With Her Appearance

It is the smart woman who makes the most of her appearance. Many of those whose names



have come to us through the pages of history are women who knew how to make a plain face pretty. The art of makeup is an important womanly skill which needs developing.

Helen of Troy is known to everyone and Cleopatra was a past mistress of this art. An archaeological exhibition from Princeton university discovered in 1930, in a tomb in corinth dating back to 400 B.C., a small terra cotta vanity box which was found to contain cubes of lead carbonate.

This dangerous preparation is believed to have been used as face powder by the ladies of Ancient Greece! Since long before Cleopatra first dipped her brow finger in a salve pot the old cultivation of beauty has been a subject which has fascinated women.

I have worked in salons and been to beauty schools in London, Vienna, Paris, Cairo and owned a salon in South West Africa for many years and always I come up against the same skin problems and am asked the same questions.

Makeup Mask

I have found that in the States the average girl commences using makeup quite a while before girls in other countries do, and I have also found that girls here are inclined to resort to heavy makeup which covers up their blemishes and blackheads instead of working at clearing up the condition

through the proper use of the correct cosmetics.

After spending money on an array of pretty bottles and jars containing cosmetics a woman is often sadly disillusioned because she does not at once acquire the lure of an oriental houri plus the finish of a Hollywood filmstar.

The trouble, of course, is that most women are not sure of what their particular skin needs. They buy preparations, don't use them correctly and are then apt to say "oh, that cream is no good!" This is not quite fair of them as a cream will do what it says if it is used correctly and faithfully.

Thorough Cleansing

But how can the average salesgirl judge what your skin is like under its makeup when she can't even see the real color of your skin! The skin should be cleansed thoroughly and examined by an experienced person who can then recommend the proper preparations and show you how to use them. We all know that very often makeup changes on the skin after a while and so it is nicer to see what it is like on your skin before buying a particular brand.

My first question to someone seeking advice is always: "With what do you cleanse your skin?" and invariably I get the answer, "Just soap and water."

A clean skin is a healthy skin and a healthy skin radiates natural beauty but soap and water alone will not cleanse the skin thoroughly. It only cleanses the surface. It has been proven that cleansing lotions and creams alone can get the skin cleaner than soap and water.

I always recommend the use of a cleansing lotion instead of a cream as it will remove every particle of soiled makeup and it will not overgrease the skin

or reappear as creams are so often apt to do. A good cleansing lotion is a soothing lotion which contains oils to lubricate without clogging the pores.

Lotion Important

Your cleansing lotion should be your first and most important beauty preparation. It should be used every night without fail and if you feel you still must use soap then be sure that you have a mild soap made especially for the face. Use it in the morning only with tepid water followed by icecold water to which a few drops of bracing lotion has been added to increase the circulation and to keep the muscles firm.

Blackheads are caused by the increased activity of the sebaceous glands and accumulations of dirt and oils in the pores. This is an obstinate condition which readily responds to treatment.

Very often this condition is accompanied by spots and pimples which are irritated by too frequent use of soap and water. Often women are not careful to rinse away every vestige of soap which is very bad for the skin.
