Rosewall, Flam Win; Move to Semi-Finals

BRISBANE (AP) — Ken Rosewall, Australia's defending tennis champion, collapsed during the intermission in his match with Mal Anderson Thursday but recovered to win his way into the semi-finals of the national championships.

He was joined there by Herbie Flam, little veteran from Beverly Hills, Calif., who staggered through to a four-set victory over Australia's Ashley Cooper after America's other entry, Gil Shea of Los Angeles, had been eliminated.

Rosewall's collapse came while he was taking a shower during the break after the third set. Later however, he returned to the court and closed out his countryman, 6-4, 6-3, 5-7, 8-6.

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Oregon Matmen Meet WSC Next

Still undefeated, the Duck wrestling squad travels to Pullman this weekend for a return match with the Washington State Cougars. Oregon Coach Bill Hammer has indicated that the same eight members of the squad who competed in last week's 19-11 triumph over the Cougars, will also make the Pullman trip.

Hammer was well pleased with last Saturday's team effort against Washington State. He expects, however, a probable improvement in the lower weight performances which were "sub par" in respect to previous expectations. Although hurt by graduation, he stated that the Cougars have been strong and will be more so in a home appearance.

The match with Washington State marks the first of six varsity matches in two weeks. During this period, the Ducks will face Washington State, and then

San Jose State, Oregon State, Portland State again, UCLA and the Multnomah Athletic club of Portland, in that order. Despite the obviously rigorous grind, Hammer reported an optimistic team outlook, and remarked on the good physical condition of the entire stand.

Following the WSC trip, the Ducks will have five consecutive McArthur court appearances. The most important of the matches, of course, will be the February 4 engagement with arch-rival Oregon State. The Beavers, last team to beat Hammer's charges in a dual meet, are, in his opinion, the strongest team on the Oregon schedule.

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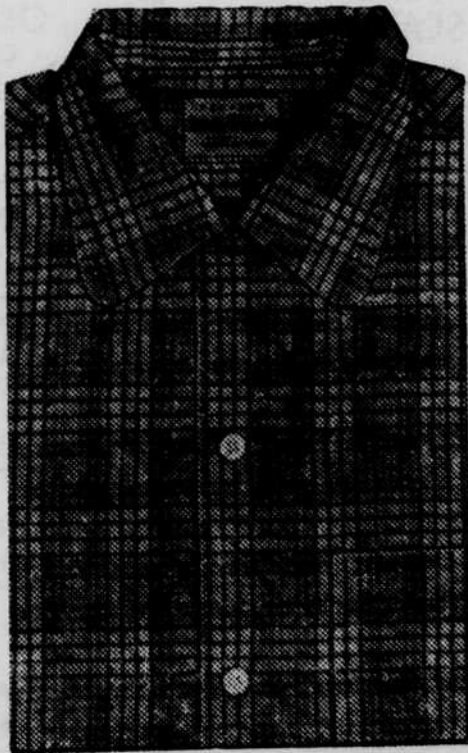
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
