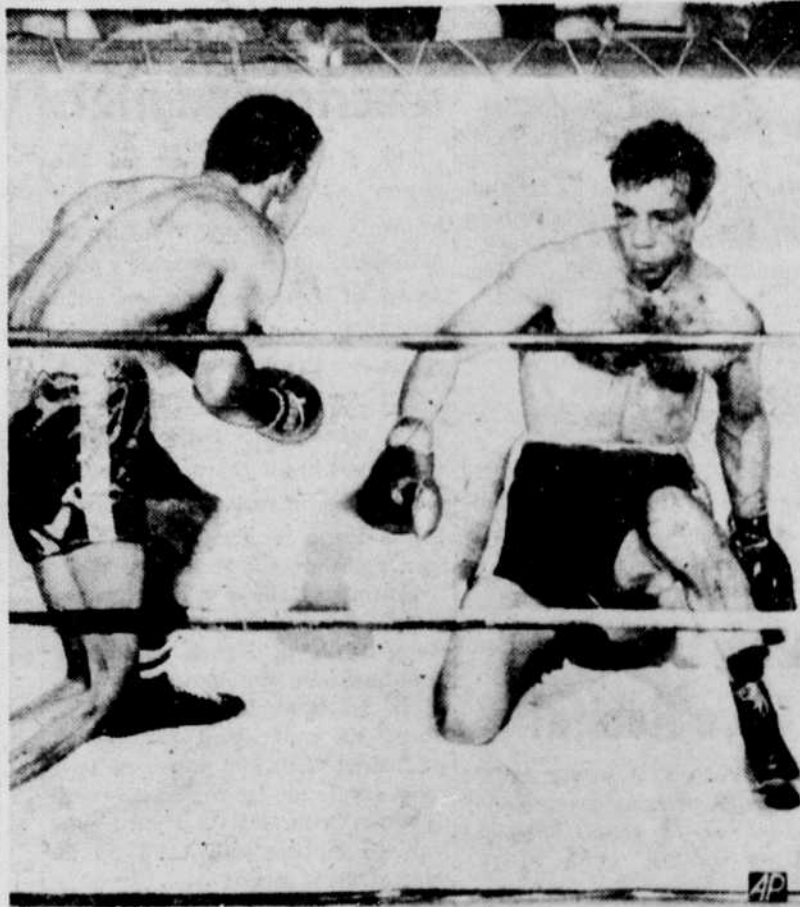
Leading all scorers was Morton's Tom Neel with 12. High for Stafford was "Whitey" Knight with 4.

USF Retains No. 1 Ranking

As the college basketball season turns toward the home stretch the race finally seems to have become stabilized with the University of San Francisco, defending national collegiate champion, and tournament-bound Dayton in the first two positions.

For the ninth straight week the sports writers and broadcasters voting in The Associated Press poll gave first place to the San Francisco Dons by a big margin.

Dayton, which accepted a bid to the National Invitation Tournament Monday, held second place by a comfortable margin and the first six teams in the rankings remained in the places they held a week ago.

The only changes in the top 10 came as a result of Temple's first loss of the season and Duke's not-too-surprising victory over North Carolina.

Temple's defeat left St. Francis of Brooklyn as the only undefeated major college team besides San Francisco. The Terriers, who made Creighton their 15th victim, didn't get as much voting support as they did a week ago and their 99 points were good only for 16th place.

Although all the top 10 teams have two or more games to play this week, San Francisco's winning streak hardly seems in danger. The Dons play College of the Pacific, which has won its last four but has only a 10-9 record for the season, Tuesday night. They meet already-beaten Fresno State Friday.

NCAA Regional Ducats on Sale

Mail orders and applications for tickets for the 1956 Western regional basketball tournament will be accepted through the mails on Monday, February 20, according to Jim Barratt, OSC athletic business manager. The tournament will be played at Corvallis on March 16 and 17.

A limit of four tickets per applicant will be allowed with one applicant to an envelope. All seats are reserved at \$2.50 for each night. Each of the four participating teams will receive a minimum of 250 choice tickets per night to serve their own students. For three of the last four tournaments held here, immediate sell-outs resulted, and last year, with Oregon State entered in the tournament, 7,000 mail orders were received the first day orders were accepted.

On Friday, March 16, the Pacific Coast conference champion will play the California Basketball Association winner. As things stand now, that will mean a rematch between unbeaten San Francisco, and the powerful Bruin's of UCLA. At 9:30, the winner of an earlier playoff between a selected member-at-large and the Rocky Mountain conference champ will meet the Mountain States conference titlist. On Saturday at 7:30, the two previous losers play, and at 9:30 the first night winners will play for the title. The winner of this game goes to the NCAA finals at Evanston, Illinois, on March 22-23.
