Trade Board Hosts Chinese Economist

Robin C. Hu, counselor of the ministry of economic affairs, Taiwan, Republic of China, will be the guest of the University's Foreign Trade Advisory board when it meets with seniors from the school of business administration Thursday afternoon and evening.

Hu will be in Oregon to study business management. He will be primarily concerned with legal matters relating to foreign investment, since he assists in drafting new statutes and regulations in this field.

According to A. L. Lomax, professor of business administration, the advisory board is comprised of a group of Portland exporters and importers, freight forwarders and Customs House brokers, international bankers, and those engaged in transporting and handling commodities.

The board meets periodically with students who are interested in the field of foreign trade. Round-table discussions are held, during which the students may ask questions of the businessmen.
