

Model Convention Delegates Picked

Delegates were chosen to represent China (Oregon) at the Model U.N. to be held in Corvallis April 4 and 5. Delegates chosen were: Chuck Kreamer, Wynn Dahlgren, Steve Chemytsch, Sanford Milkes, Elton Engstrom, Regina Hannon, Sam Chow, Evelyn Olsen, Mary Lou Qualls, John McDermott and Elliott Carlson, press representative.

The Model U.N. is an educational convention of student delegations from 76 Western colleges, who represent various nations in model meetings of the United Nations. It is sponsored each year by one of the participating colleges. Previous host schools have been Stanford, USC, UC, UCLA, and San Francisco State. Attendance at the conference is estimated to be around 1200, plus thousands of Oregonians who will attend as spectators.

Young Democrats Plan to Attend State Convention

State Candidates at Convention
"Democratic state candidates will be en masse at the convention which will make it a good time to see and hear them," according to Ralph Hillier, national committeeman of the Oregon Young Democrats.

Elton Engstrom, co-chairman of the Oregon delegation to the mock Democratic convention at Willamette university in May, said Oregon would send a delegation of 30.

The mock conventions are held every election year by the party out of office. The 1952 convention had a turn-out of 250 delegates. Eisenhower was nominated on the fourth ballot, showing the validity of the convention.

States Assigned

Each delegation to the mock convention is assigned a state and nominates candidates according to that state's apparent tendencies.

Bill Frye, club president, stressed the need for new members in the local club. Many big things are coming up where good representation will be needed. Everyone is urged to come to the meetings just to see how they operate, he said. With the national elections coming up it is important to get an active start now, he said.
