

Leaders Discuss YR Endorsement

In the face of rising speculation about whether the Republican pre-primary convention to be held in Eugene this Friday and Saturday will endorse senatorial candidates, two campus Republican leaders gave answer Tuesday.

Jim McKenney, president of the University YR group said "I don't think there will be any endorsement of either candidate because both will be here as guests of the pre-primary convention. The convention will not be to endorse candidates, but to draw up resolutions concerning Republican policy in the state."

No Endorsement Wanted

Jerry Jones, assistant chairman to the conference, and president of the Western Council of College Young Republican clubs, said, "Both Secretary McKay and Phil Hitchcock have stated that they do not want the Federation to endorse them. Personally, I think and hope that they will comply with their wishes."

Jones said that the College League Board of Young Republicans had voted to endorse Hitchcock at a board meeting in Portland on March 18. He said this meeting was attended by representatives of each college YR club with the exception of Eastern Oregon College of Education at LaGrande.

The endorsement for Hitchcock, he explained, must now be approved by the members of each college club before group action by that club can be taken on

Hitchcock's behalf. He said he felt that the Board's action should be taken by members of College League clubs as "a strong recommendation" for Hitchcock.

Has Right to Endorse

Jones said that the College League, while a separate group from the YR Federation which consists of county clubs, still makes up part of the Federation. He stated however, that the 1954 November convention gave both federation and college league groups the right to endorse primary candidates. He also said he thought the UO Young Republicans would decide at this evening's meeting (SU, 7:15 p.m.) whether or not they will back Hitchcock.

The convention this weekend will feature Governor Elmo Smith as Friday night's banquet speaker. Guest speaker at the Saturday night banquet will be Craig Hosmer, California congressman. A "Meet the Candidates" luncheon will be held Saturday.

Convention costs are registration, \$1; Friday banquet, \$2.50; Saturday luncheon, \$1.50, and Saturday banquet, \$3.50.

Democrats Meet To Pick Officers

Young Democrats meet tonight in the Student Union at 7:30 to elect a vice president and treasurer. The club will also discuss the Young Democrats convention in Portland April 20-22.

Senator Estes Kefauver will be the Keynote speaker for the Convention. Elton Engstrom, president of the campus club said, "Regardless of whether you are a Democrat or a member of this club, anyone interested in hearing Kefauver speak is welcome to attend the banquet." Keith Skelton, Eugene attorney and Democratic candidate for state representative, will be at the meeting tonight. Skelton recently said that faculty members are shirking their duty by not running for public offices.

Art Discussed in Browsing Room

Wallace Baldinger, associate professor of art and director of the Art Museum, spoke Wednesday night on "Satin and Porcelain: Painting and Sculpture in the Time of Mozart" at the Browsing Room lecture.

Baldinger discussed, with the use of colored slides, the rise of

the rococo style of art from the baroque, and the rise of the neoclassic at the beginning of the 19th Century as the rococo lost influence and declined.

Mark Sponenburgh, associate professor of art, discussed briefly the art of porcelain of the period. Baldinger traced the development of sculpture and painting.

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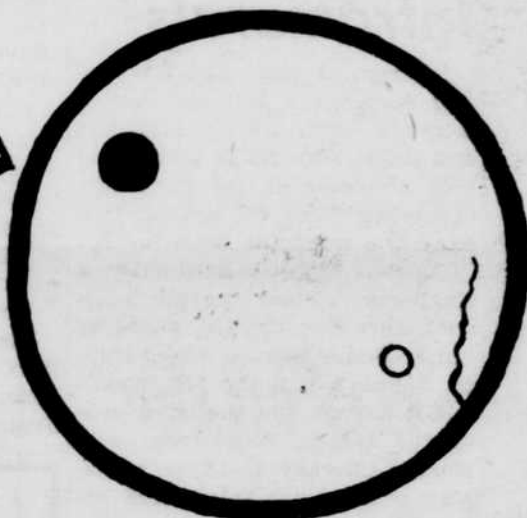
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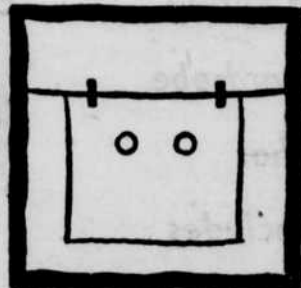
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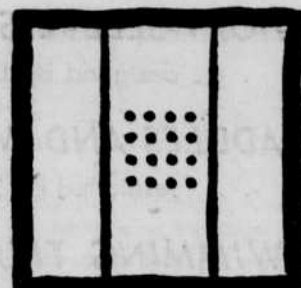
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
