Taped TV Shows Sold Way Ahead of Schedule

Various types of tape recording for television have been in the experimental stage for three or four years and the networks predicted the development of a practical and workable type by mid-1957. However, Ampex company announced this week the development and subsequent sale of a new video tape system.

CBS network has purchased three of the now scheduled eight units for an announced price of \$75,000 each. These are expected to be ready by August and will be put into use immediately. A demonstration was given at the recent National Association of Radio and Television Broadcasters convention.

The new system offers many advantages over the previous experimental units. Up to this date, the best that had been perfected was by Bing Crosby Enterprises and could take up to forty minutes on one tape. The Ampex process will record up to one hour on each tape, and the tape can be erased and re-used several times.

West Coast viewers will greatly

profit from the new process, as this will enable CBS to bridge the three-hour time difference between the East and West. It will also be more economical than the Kinescope recording system.

The Ampex system has the slowest recording time of those yet proposed. According to the network, the system can easily be developed to record color shows and probably will reach this in the near future.

So good-bye to kinescope recordings. The West Coast will not be sad to see them go. Meanwhile, viewers can await the new Ampex system with anticipation.

Pays for Plays

ScreenGems is now trying to combat the lack of good television dramatic material by offering scholarship payments for plays and other material for the medium. Schools named so far for the scholarship program include University of Chicago, Fordham and the University of Iowa. More will be named soon.

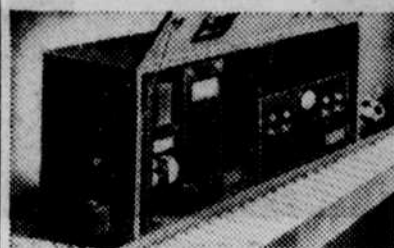

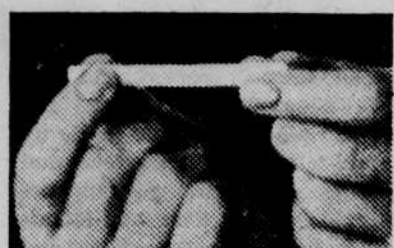
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
