

# House Librarians Discuss Contests

Library Day prize contest, the Peter Pauper press essay contest, and the Josephine Evans Harpham silver cup contest were discussed at a meeting of the House librarians yesterday, in the browsing room of the Student Union.

A special interest of the group was the annual student Library Day prize contest under the sponsorship of the Co-op, the Association of Patrons and Friends of the University of Oregon library, Mrs. Henry Tromp and Prouty's Old Book store. Each group sponsors a category in the contest. The contests are under the general direction of Miss Bernice Rise, browsing room librarian, and the House librarians.

The purpose of the contest is to stimulate interest for books and reading, according to Miss Rise.

The size of the library entered does not influence the decision of the judges. Fifteen to 50 books may be exhibited. A student may enter as many libraries as he wishes and these libraries may contain paper backed books, required textbooks, pamphlets, maps, charts and other non-book material.

The contest was founded in 1939 by Miss Rise. That year, she says, 14 libraries were exhibited. In recent years 60 to 90 li-

raries have been entered and exhibited in the contest.

Entries must be made by noon, May 18 to Miss Rise in the browsing room in the SU. The entries must be arranged in the reserve reading room May 19. Further information may be obtained from Miss Rise.
