9 p.m. (13) "Has Anybody Seen My Gal," a play on "Lux Video Theatre" adapted from the original movie, relates how a \$100,000 bequest from an eccentric millionaire disrupts a Vermont family.

## Friday

6 p.m. (13) A ten-round featherweight bout from Washington on "Cavalcade of Sports" matches Cherif Hamia of France against Ike Chestnut of New York City. In 26 bouts, Hamia has achieved a rating of three with a total of 24 wins and one loss and one decision.

# Kraft Theatre Show Claimed Successful

One of the most ambitious hour television shows and also most successful, according to national critics, was "Kraft Television Theatre" production of "A Night to Remember," based on Walter Lord's best seller. Channel 13 will present a re-run of this program Wednesday night at 8 p.m.

The show originally was live, and was quite an experiment in live telecasting. Elaborate sets were used, including authentic reconstructions from the "Titanic's" blueprints. In all, 31 sets were used and over \$95,000 went into the show. This may become one of television's classics.

## Pre-Existence

Claude Rains is the narrator for the story of the 1912 tragedy in which 2200 people died.

Shades of Bridie Murphy! Not only do the magazines, radio, and other mediums take up the "pre-existence" theory, but now it hits television. Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m. over channel 6 "Science Fiction Theatre" will present "Who Is This Man," which, according to advance publicity, deals with the discovery of a boy's previous life during the time of the Old West.

Some of the sceptics will probably remark that it is certainly appropriate to buy a plot of this type.

## Noise Annoys Congressman

One person who objects to publicity, or at least loud commercials, is Congressman Craig Hosmer from California. He is complaining (in a loud voice) about the loud commercials and the higher-than-normal volume used in them. He wants other sufferers to write him at House Office Building 241, Washington, D.C. and add to the case that he intends to present to the National

Association of Radio and Television Broadcasters.

This is a switch. Usually the television viewers or radio listeners are complaining about loud political announcements. Hosmer has a point, though. Many of the shows, especially those that switch microphones for the commercials have definite changes in volume. It is annoying, and perhaps this campaign will call the networks' attention to the problem.

## Saving Time Changes Schedules

Daylight saving time is again changing television and radio schedules and the time differences are really disrupting program planning. Channel 13 personnel are still planning the summer schedule and have added several new shows.

"Disneyland" will continue to be scheduled for 2:30 p.m. Sunday. "Telephone Time with John Nesbitt" is shown at 10 p.m. Sunday and features true-life dramas each week.

"M-G-M Parade," which is not on a local network, is presenting its last show this week. This, the first of the film studio productions to be dropped, did not capture the rating, sponsors or interest that was hoped. Evidently the viewers just did not want their movies in 15 minute hunks.

## Webb Plans New Show

Jack Webb fans will be pleased to learn of the new show that he is planning for the television networks. This one will be based on his recent movie "Pete Kelly's Blues" and the series may carry the same title. He reportedly is trying to sign Bob Crosby for the show.
