Graham Asks Quick Execution

DENVER (AP)—A signed affidavit by condemned murderer John Gilbert Graham, 24, requests that he be put to death in Colorado's gas chamber as soon as possible.

A district court jury of seven men and five women convicted Graham Friday of killing his mother, Mrs. Daisie E. King, 55, by dynamiting a commercial airliner. The crash took 44 lives.

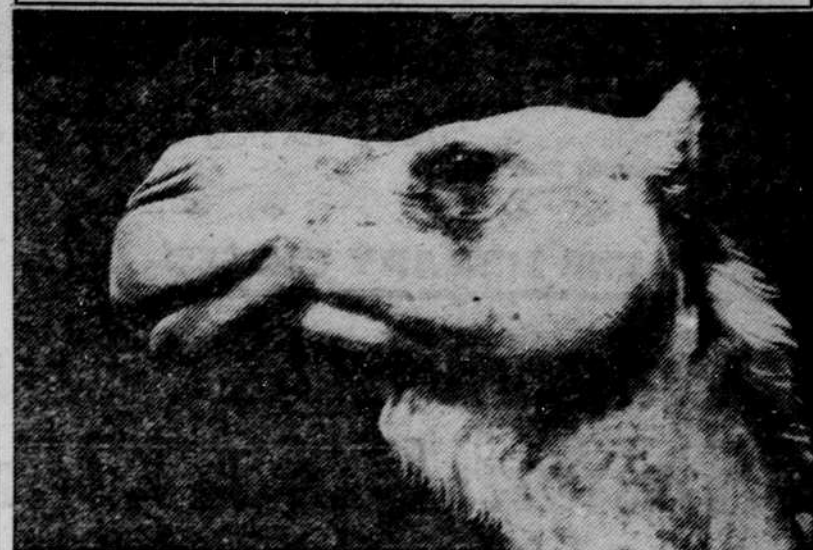
The jurors recommended Graham, the father of two small children, be executed, and in his affidavit written in the presence of witnesses in his jail cell Saturday, Graham said, in part:

"I accept the verdict of the jury and desire that it be carried out with all convenient speed. This is my wish. I have been advised by my attorneys that under the law the sentence of death requires that it be appealed to the highest court of this state.

"I desire to waive that provision of law."

The crew-cut, boyish-appearing convicted slayer was pictured as resigned to death.

Negro Cleric Against Church Integration

PITTSBURGH (AP)—A Negro church leader said Sunday the Negro church must retain its separate identity and not die through religious integration.

Speaking at the African Methodist Episcopal Zion conference, Bishop H. B. Shaw of Wilmington, N.C., said social integration is logical in the practice of Christianity, but he said the Negro must maintain his individuality as a Christian.

"The church is too essential to the Negro, particularly in this age of civil rights, to be lost in the shuffle of integration," Bishop Shaw declared. "Developed by the Negro in slavery, the church has always given him political guidance, entertainment, cultural development and self expression."

Bishop Shaw said his remarks expressed the sentiment not only of the board of bishops but the entire membership of the AME Zion church.

Through his church, the bishop said, the Negro can continue to make significant contributions to the American and Christian ways of life as he is propelled by his hopes, ambitions and heritage.

Sniper Sprays Church Procession; 1 Dead

NEW YORK (AP)—A sniper, shooting from a rooming house across the street, pumped bullets into an Easter procession entering an Eastern Orthodox church Saturday night, killing one person and wounding five.

The service, attended by some 400 persons, many of them Romanian refugees, broke up in screaming panic.

Suspect Sought

Police sought Tony Tudorache, 60, occupant of the strategically located room where detectives found a rifle and four boxes of shells.

The Very Rev. Florian Caldau, the church's anti-communist pastor, who may have been an intended victim, said Tudorache was a "trained agent" of the communists, and had been sent to make trouble.

Father Caldau, who has made broadcasts behind the Iron Curtain for Radio Free Europe, said Tudorache "has threatened me

and very many others of the congregation."

But police insisted that Tudorache was only a bitter church dissenter and denied any communist angle to the shooting.

"Let's not make a foreign intrigue drama out of this," said detective chief James Leggett.

The shots also may have been intended for Romania's former Princess Ileana, sister of the late King Carol, who attended midnight church procession with her husband.

Primaries Top Political News

The quickening pace of national election year politics finds six states holding primary elections this week.

Balloting is scheduled Monday in Maryland and on Tuesday in Indiana, Ohio, West Virginia, Florida and New Mexico. The Florida balloting for state offices is preliminary to a May 29 presidential primary.

Political highspot of the past weekend was Sen. Lyndon Johnson's sweeping victory over Gov. Allan Shivers for control of the state Democratic Party in Texas.

Johnson, the U.S. Senate Democratic leader, is pledged to work for party unity in the national campaign.
