

Oregon to Be 'Deep South' At Willamette

The final preparatory meeting for the University delegation to the Willamette Mock Democratic convention will be held Thursday evening at 7:30 p.m. in the SU. The U. of O. delegation headed by Dick Briggs and Elton Engstrom, will represent seven "deep South" states.

Dick Briggs said Wednesday that the delegation is planning to form "a Southern bloc, and he said there "very likely will be a walk-out . . . and demonstrations." He said they have 260 delegate votes at their disposal.

The two-day convention will include registration, credentials and resolutions meetings, and caucusing Friday night. On Saturday, the convention will begin, with committee meetings.
