

All-Campus Sing Tonight at 8 p.m.

Fourteen living organizations will demonstrate their singing ability at the All-Campus Sing, starting at 8 p.m. tonight in McArthur Court. Tickets are 85 cents a person.

Cups will be presented to the best three groups in both the men's and women's divisions. Dick Allen and Jim Carter, co-chairmen of the Sing, will make the presentation of the rotating cups which are sponsored by Panhellenic council and Inter-Fraternity council.

The group, songleader, song and the order in which they will sing are as follows:

First is Alpha Chi Omega singing "Reverie," led by Jody Rogers. Beta Theta Pi, under the direction of Rob Roy will sing "Without a Song." "Rock-a-ma Soul" is Ann Judson House's choice, led by June Kelso.

Campbell club will sing "Frank Hall Medley," led by Robert Parker. Chi Omega will follow them with "Waitin' For My Dearie," conducted by Mary Ann Megale. "The Wide Missouri" will be sung by Phi Delta Theta, led by Spen-

cer Snow. With Pat Lydiard directing, Delta Gamma will sing "Cindy."

Next is Phi Kappa Sigma with "Johnny Sands," led by Bob Ransom, followed by Hendricks hall singing "Madam Geanette," directed by Helen Simon. Philadelphia house will sing "Ride the Chariot," led by Edwin Boring. Thiele Rollow will direct Kappa Alpha Theta in "When You're Smilin'."

"Brothers Sing On," led by John Hedford, is Sigma Alpha Epsilon's choice. Kappa Kappa Gamma follows with "The House I Live In," directed by Barbara Williams. Last on the program is Sigma Phi Epsilon, led by Vondis Miller, singing "Deep River."

Judging is on tonal quality (harmony intonation)—30 percent; interpretation (audience appeal)—20 percent; diction — 20 percent; musical arrangement (suitability for voices and general suitability for voices and of song) —10 percent; following the director—10 percent; and stage appearance (neatness)—10 percent.
