

Ducklings Down Clark J. C. 7-4

The Oregon Frosh, behind the effective pitching of Stan Thompson and Denny Bowling, downed Clark J. C. Saturday, May 19, by the score of 7-4. The game was played at Vancouver, Washington.

Thompson pitched the first 5 2/3 innings, striking out nine. Last Tuesday, he also struck out nine hitters in posting his first win of the season, a no-hitter against Tillamook high school. In 12 2/3 innings, the southpaw from Nyssa has now struck out 18 batters. Bowling relieved Thompson in the sixth, after Clark had touched Thompson for three hits and two runs, and he pitched hitless ball for the last 3 1/3 innings.

Clark jumped into a quick one run lead in the first inning when a single, sacrifice, and another single scored the tally. The Frosh tied it up in the top of the fourth on a walk to Larry Hughes, a ground-out, and a line single to left by Bob Sturgis that scored the run.

Hughes Gets Timely Hit

The Frosh exploded in the fifth, scoring four runs, taking a lead that they never lost. Thompson started the rally out by singling to center, Ronnie Connor then walked, Fred Lennerd then got aboard via an error to load the bases. Larry Hughes, Frosh clean-up hitter, then blasted a triple to deep centerfield to score all three runners. Hughes then scored on a ground out by Ellis Olson.

Clark got two runs in the last of the sixth, but Bowling held them to just one run for the rest of the game, and that was scored on two errors. The Frosh scored the final two runs in the top of the ninth, when Connor got on base by being hit by the pitcher, and Dick Ruark got aboard via a Clark error. Fred Lennerd then hit a triple, scoring both runners.

Jim Gallas, Ed Burke and Ken Davis led the Clark attack by
