

Intramural Crown Won by Phi Delta

By grabbing team honors in the IM track test Tuesday afternoon, Phi Delta Theta donned its third consecutive intramural crown. Although the year's points have not been officially totaled, the Phi Deltas are far enough ahead of second-place Hale Kane to insure their ownership of the 1955-56 trophy.

A protest was filed Friday against the runner-up group, which could conceivably affect overall point totals for the lower places. Phi Delta Theta and Alpha Tau Omega accused Hale Kane of proselyting trackmen from other dorms for the preliminaries and finals. A decision was to have been rendered after a hearing by the intramural administrative board.

The Phi Deltas enjoyed a fabulous IM year, winning A and B trophies in basketball and repeating with a sweep of both divisions in basketball. To this they added the track championship, a second-place in softball and numerous lesser place-points.

With possible golf and tennis scores to be added to their score, the Phi Deltas are already ahead of any point total racked up since 1940, with 963.

In the IM tennis finale, Dorm Counselors used their tournament experience to good advantage and dumped Hale Kane for the trophy and 100 points.

The Oregon golf team, playing under slightly damp conditions, won the Northern division championship for the seventh time since 1935, at the Corvallis Country Club last Saturday.

The four players who took part in the tournament, Bob Norquist, Art Abrahamson, Barry Ott, and Bob Prall—will all be returning next year. The first three will all be seniors in 1957, and Prall will be a junior.

Oregon also won the dual meet competition, for the seventh year in the ten years of dual meet participation. It has also tied twice for first with Washington during this time.

The next competition for the team will be in the NCAA, where six players are entered, and the four best scores are counted.

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Phi Delta Theta Cops Track Title

Jerry Urness won the 75 and 330-yard dashes to score 20 points as he led Phi Delta Theta to the 1956 intramural track championship.

The Phi Delt's accumulated a total of 50 points to second place Hale Kane's 44 1/5. It was a tight battle right down to the final event, the relay, with the Phi Deltas leading by a slim margin of four points. They managed a fourth in the event, which was more than enough to win, as Hale Kane could only manage a fifth.

Scott Takes Put

Besides winning both the dashes, the Phi Deltas also won the shot put, as Vern Scott came through with a heave of 44' 5". The rest of their points came from one third, three fourths, a fifth and a sixth.

Second high scorer of the afternoon was Chuck Tourville of Morton hall who tied for first in both the broad jump and the high jump. Tourville was deadlocked with Jerry Pool, Beta, at 5'6" in the high jump, and in the broad jump with Myron Finkbiener, Philadelphia house, at 18'10".

Hale Kane in placing second, had a pair of first places. Harold Duncan ran the 70 yard high hurdles in 9.7, and Jim Jolly won the pole vault with a jump of 11'9".

Coston Kicks to Win

The 3/4 mile run was won by Chuck Coston of Campbell club who let go a nice finishing kick, for a good time of 3:32.5.

Philadelphia house won the relay in 23.5.
