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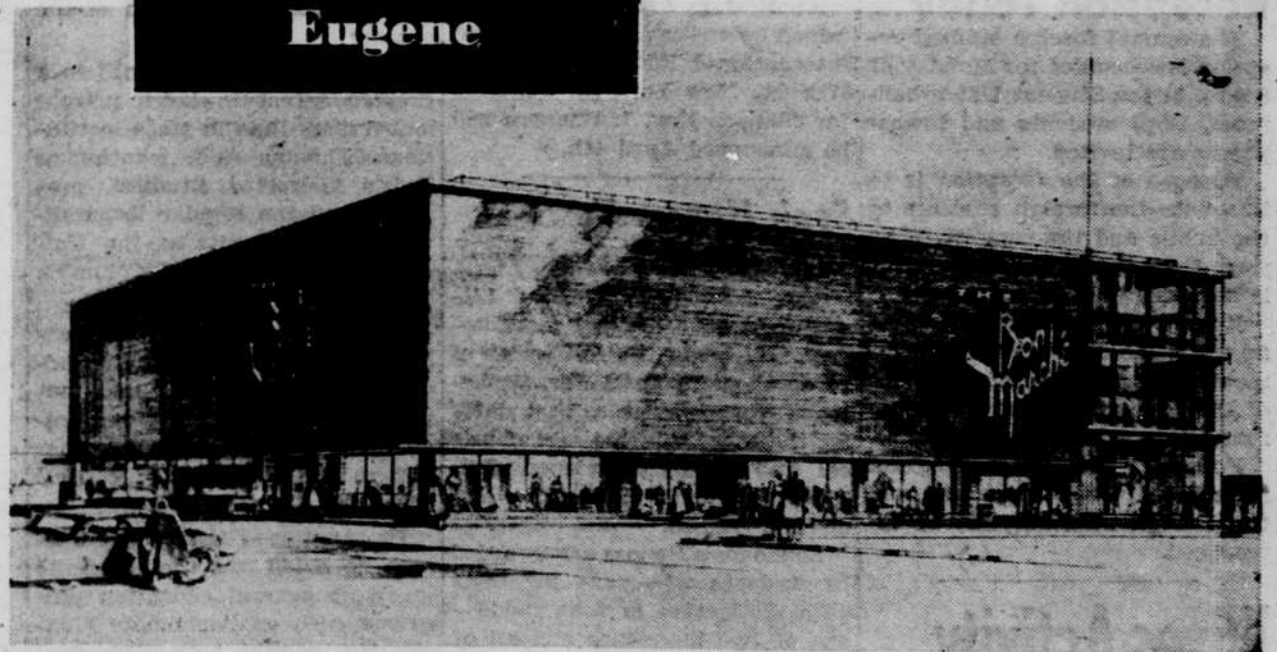
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Wm. Watts Speaks At Press Meeting

William A. Watts, public relations director for General Electric Company, Hanford, Wash., will be the banquet speaker for the 30th Annual Oregon High School Press conference. Watts is working in connection with the atomic energy project in Hanford.

Co-sponsored by the Oregon Scholastic Press association and the University's school of journalism, the conference will meet in Eugene, Oct. 12th and 13th.

The conference will be attended by delegates from high schools throughout Oregon. Last year, 831 high school publication workers and their advisors met to discuss mutual problems in publication.

On the agenda for the conference are a number of section meetings, over which faculty members of the University and other professional people will preside. On Saturday, high school members will participate in panel discussions, along with members of the campus publications.

University Constructs Eight Tennis Courts
