Kunz Retires from Active Teaching

Adolph H. Kunz, head of the department of chemistry since 1942, and a faculty member for 24 years, has retired from active teaching because of an extended illness. He has been on leave from the University for several months.

The retirement is immediately in effect.

Kunz first came to the University in 1930 from the California Institute of Technology. After

serving on the University staff for two years, Kunz went to OSU where he taught chemistry until 1934. He then returned to the University of Oregon campus.

After graduation from William Jewell college, Liberty, Mo., Kunz received a master's degree and a doctor of philosophy degree from the State University of Iowa.

During Kunz's absence Francis J. Reithe has been acting head of the chemistry department.

The election will be held Nov. 14 and all petitions should be turned in to the petition box by Nov. 7.

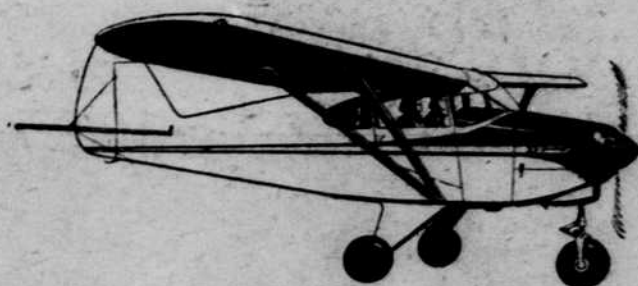
