

Schweitzer 'Remarkable,' Says Deneke in SU Talk

"Dr. Albert Schweitzer is, I think, the most remarkable of the remarkable men of our time," Margaret Deneke, honorable fellow and chairmaster of Lady Margaret Hall in Oxford, England, and a close friend of Schweitzer told a Tuesday afternoon assembly in the Student Union ballroom.

"I have never seen the power and purpose in him equalled," she continued, "and I have never seen such modesty of soul."

Met by Accident

Miss Deneke first met Schweitzer by accident in 1922 when he was conducting a lecture tour at Oxford.

In an attempt to escape an afternoon cloudburst, she went into the Church of St. Philip and St. James where she heard a man whom she recognized as Dr. Schweitzer, playing the music of Bach.

She then attended the last lecture in the series he was delivering, and made his acquaintance by offering him a ticket to a Schubert concert which she was unable to attend.

Two years later she again met Schweitzer, who invited her to visit his mission hospital in Lamborene, Africa. At that time she had a United States lecture tour planned and could not accept the

invitation; however, after the tour she visited his station.

Assists Schweitzer

In Lamborene, Miss Deneke served as a nurse and laboratory assistant to Schweitzer for about a year. She also helped him com-

plete the third hospital which he had been forced to build in Lamborene. The first one was literally eaten by ants and the second had to be destroyed because the surgical wards had become infected.

Upon the completion of the hospital, Schweitzer presented her, together with his other nurses, with a bracelet made of gold thread and elephant hair.

Miss Deneke told the group that she had learned two basic philosophies from Schweitzer who is 82 and still carrying on his medical and missionary work. "First, don't take the good things in life for-granted," and second, "have two points of view, never concentrating on your own."

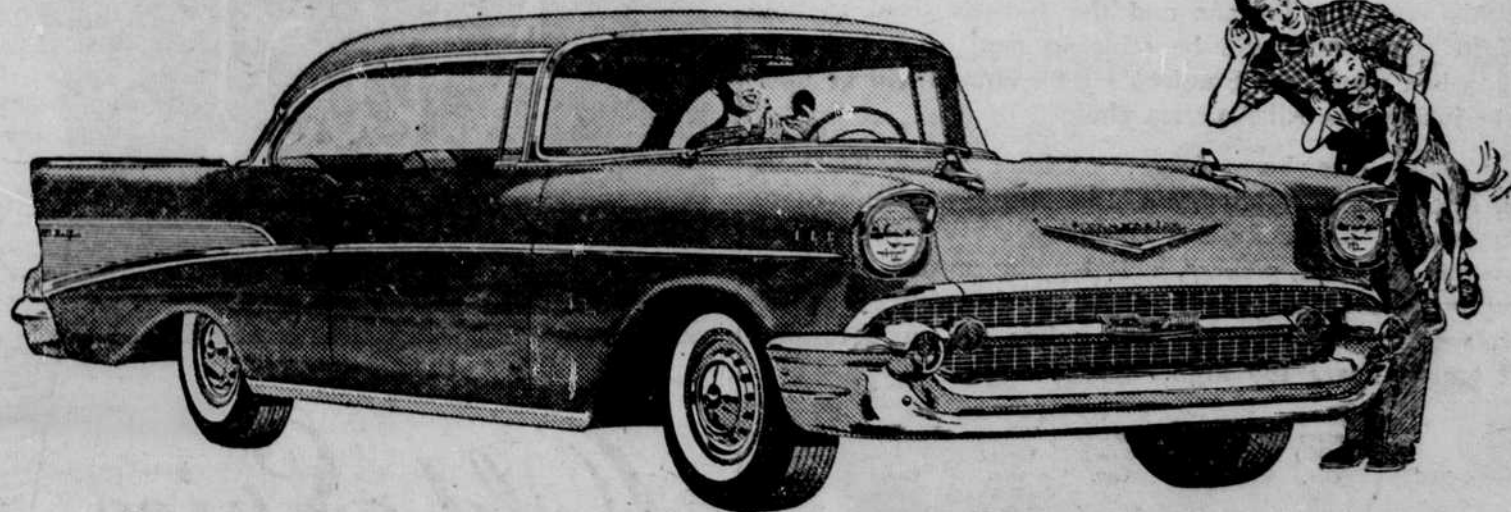
