

Alpha Phi Tops Fall GPA List

Alpha Phi, with a 2.94 average GPA, won high honors for fall term grades, with sororities generally leading the way. Right behind Alpha Phi and ahead of the top men's organization, Gamma Hall, were Alpha Delta Pi, Delta Zeta, Alpha Chi Omega and Pi Beta Phi. Campbell Club and Hale Kane finished in the number two and three spots among men's organizations.

Grades Down from Last Term

Fall term grades generally were much lower than those last spring term, which is normal. The All-University average, 2.544, was slightly lower than that of last fall term, 2.5529.

Compared to fall term of 1955, the following classifications went down: non-organization men, all men, fraternities, men's dormitories, freshman dormitories, all women and women's clubs.

Those which made gains from last fall term were men's clubs, men's residence halls, women's dormitories, sororities, and non-organization women.

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New SU Series Opens Thursday

"Sandwich Series," a new Student Union activity presenting "The Emergence of the Modern Arts" will hold its first meeting Thursday in the SU from 7:30 to 3:30 p.m.

The series, which will feature short programs throughout winter term on the development of contemporary drama, jazz, architecture, art and literature, will also offer undirected discussion throughout the series. Keynoting the "Sandwich Series" will be an informal atmosphere with refreshments and program combined in the hour-long activity.

This week's program will feature James B. Hall, assistant professor of English who will speak on modern poetry. Hall will comment upon and read selections from figures of major influence in the 19th century who were forerunners of contemporary poetry.

He also will illustrate his talk by citing such poets as E. E. Cummings, Robert Lowell and Hart Crane.

"Sandwich Series," formerly called "Soiree," is sponsored by the Creative Arts Committee. Its purpose is to provide for students in the arts to meet and discuss the contemporary arts.

Phi Psi, Delta Zeta Lead Pledge Grades

Delta Zeta and Phi Kappa Psi led the sorority and fraternity pledge class grades for fall term. The top women's group was followed by Delta Delta Delta and Kappa Alpha Theta. Fraternity runners-up were Pi Kappa Phi and Sigma Phi Epsilon.

Top grades were Delta Zeta with 2.89 and Phi Kappa Psi with 2.503.

Women once again led men in the pledge classes, as 11 of the sixteen sororities topped all men's fraternity pledge classes.

Last year Alpha Phi led women's pledge class fall term grades with 2.841, followed by Pi Beta Phi with 2.739. Men's fall term leaders were Lambda Chi Alpha 2.506 and Sigma Phi Epsilon with 2.498.
