Two Fellowships Open At University of Ceylon

Two fellowships are now open for study at the University of Ceylon, to graduate students for the academic year beginning in June 1957.

The fellowships cover tuition, board and double room, but grantees must be responsible for travel and incidental expenses. Grantees are obliged to live in a University dormitory and attend a regular schedule of classes.

Suggested fields of study are sociology, economics, geography and history of Ceylon; Pali, the language of the early Buddhist scriptures, and Buddhist doctrines, history, art, and architecture; Indian philosophy and history, and Indo-Aryan linguistics. All lectures except a few in oriental languages are given in English.

To be eligible for the program, applicants must have United States citizenship by date of ap-

plication; a good academic or professional record if the applicant is not a recent graduate; good moral character, personality, and adaptability; and a broad knowledge of the culture of the United States; and good health.

Applicants must be filed not later than Jan. 15. For further details on securing the necessary paper, students should see Kenneth S. Ghent, Director of Foreign students, at the Office of Student Affairs.
