University radio station KWAX will begin its winter term broadcasting tonight at 6 p.m.—under the direction of Bob Chapman and Roy Jacobson.

A new wire-tapped phone service ext. 532 has been installed. This special service will provide an opportunity for students and living organizations who wish to have announcements made or an event covered to do so by calling this extension.

## Air Use Seen

The conversation will be recorded and then used on the air. These phone calls should be made a day or so before the date it is wanted on the air, however, flash happenings will be given the same night if at all possible.

All offices and departments of the station have been converted into one large office so that girls may be on hand to receive calls from 7:30 until 11 p.m. The regular radio station phone number ext. 402 is still available for all conversations which are not for use on the air.

## World News Coverage

Coverage of world news will now be completed and up-to-date due to recent installment of United Press wire service. The regular campus news and sports will also continue to be covered. Two hours of uninterrupted background music on "study
