

Ducklings Whip Pilot Reserves, Clark JC Quint

Oregon's freshman basketball squad opened the 1957 season with victories over the University of Portland junior varsity and Clark college Friday and Saturday nights.

The junior Pilots were first to feel the blunt of the Duckling attack when they dropped a 75-52 decision to the inexperienced but eager Eugene quintet at the Portland team's gym. The following night the Ducklings had a little rougher time, but downed Clark 71-61 at the Hudson Bay gym in Vancouver, Wash.

The Ducklings proved to have a stronger offense in both games and their greater shooting accuracy was the deciding factor.

Oregon started slowly against the Pilots but soon smoothed out the rustiness of their first game action. They led all the way and by halftime held a 32-23 lead.

In the second half the Ducklings really found the range and with forward Jerry Anderson, center, Dale Jones and guard Doug Lundstrom leading the way, Oregon had little trouble in handing the Pilots their seventh loss in 11 games during the 1956-57 campaign.

Anderson netted 20 points for high scoring honors, while the jayvees Art Bull tallied 18. Jones and Lundstrom added 17 and 16 counters for the frosh respectively.

In Saturday's tilt, it was 6-0 guard Chuck Rask who kept the Ducklings in the ball game during a close first half against Clark. Rask, who was an all-stater for Jefferson high school last year, connected for 15 counters in the first 20 minutes of play.

Meanwhile, the Ducklings were moving to a 37-31 halftime lead.

Opening the second half Anderson hit on a jump shot to send the Ducklings into an eight point lead. Clark closed the gap to 39-35 but the Ducklings pulled away once again and that was as close as the home team came.

Midway in the period Oregon moved to a 12 point advantage but the Penguins fought back and with 2:05 remaining, the score read 65-59. Don Kirsch's crew called time out and when play resumed the Ducklings took advantage of their over-anxious opponents by scoring six final points.

Rask finished the night with 21 points and was also a stand-out on defense with his ball-hawking tactics. Bill Chronis led the losers with 22.

With two victories under their belts, the freshman squad returns to Eugene this weekend with games to tap both Friday and Saturday nights.

As preliminaries to the varsity games against Idaho, the Ducklings will face Eugene AAU on Friday and the Multnomah Athletic club on Saturday. Both games start at 5:45 p.m.

California Whips Oregon In Opening PCC Contests

Oregon's Webfoots opened their 1957 conference season Friday and Saturday nights, bowing to California twice. The Golden Bears stayed undefeated in PCC play this season by bouncing Oregon 53-46 on Friday night and 71-57 Saturday.

Both games were lost in the first half, as the Ducks outscored the Bears in the second half Friday night and stayed even with them in the final frame on Saturday.

Hal Duffy, 6'6" center, was the series high point man for the Ducks. He picked up 34 points in the two games to 30 for forward Charlie Franklin.

Cal 53, Ducks 46

A miserable first half, possibly brought on by first-game jitters in a young Oregon team, cost the Ducks the ball game and made it the fourth straight conference win for Cal. The Web-

foots lost the ball nine times in the half, through mistakes and inability to solve the Cal pressing defense. Most of the fouling in that half was done by the overeager Webfoots, and dead-eyed Bears made good on most of their chances.

When the Webfoots could hang onto the ball, they seemed to find a lid over the basket, as they recorded only one field goal in the last 13 minutes of the half.

Duffy led all scorers with 20 points on seven field goals and six out of seven from the charity line. Cal captain Larry Friend led his club with 16 points, hitting from outside and inside equally well. Earl Robinson of the Bears collected 14, and Charlie Franklin of Oregon got 13.

Steve Belko's green-shirted crew looked like a different team in the second half, as they outscored the Bears, 33-26. Good work at the free throw line by Franklin and Duffy's 16 points put Oregon back in the game, but Friend came to his team's rescue with two fast buckets and the Bears were never headed.

Oregon rebounded well against the taller Californians, the Bears owning a slight edge at game's end, 36-35. Franklin and 6'7" Duane Asplund of the Bears both had 10 and Duffy pulled down nine for the evening.

Oregon took an early lead, but again it was Friend who scored twice to end the Webfoots' brief moment of glory. Franklin hit a free throw and Bud Kuykendall a two-hander from outside before the Bears came to life on goals by Robinson and Don McIntosh. Wimp Hastings, who amazed the Cal fans during the series with his deft ball handling, gave the Ducks their last lead at 5-4.

Cal's pressing defense again gave the Ducks more than they could handle, although it was 16-15 after eight minutes of play. That was as close as the Webfoots could come, however, for the Bears rang up ten points before Oregon could find the range again.

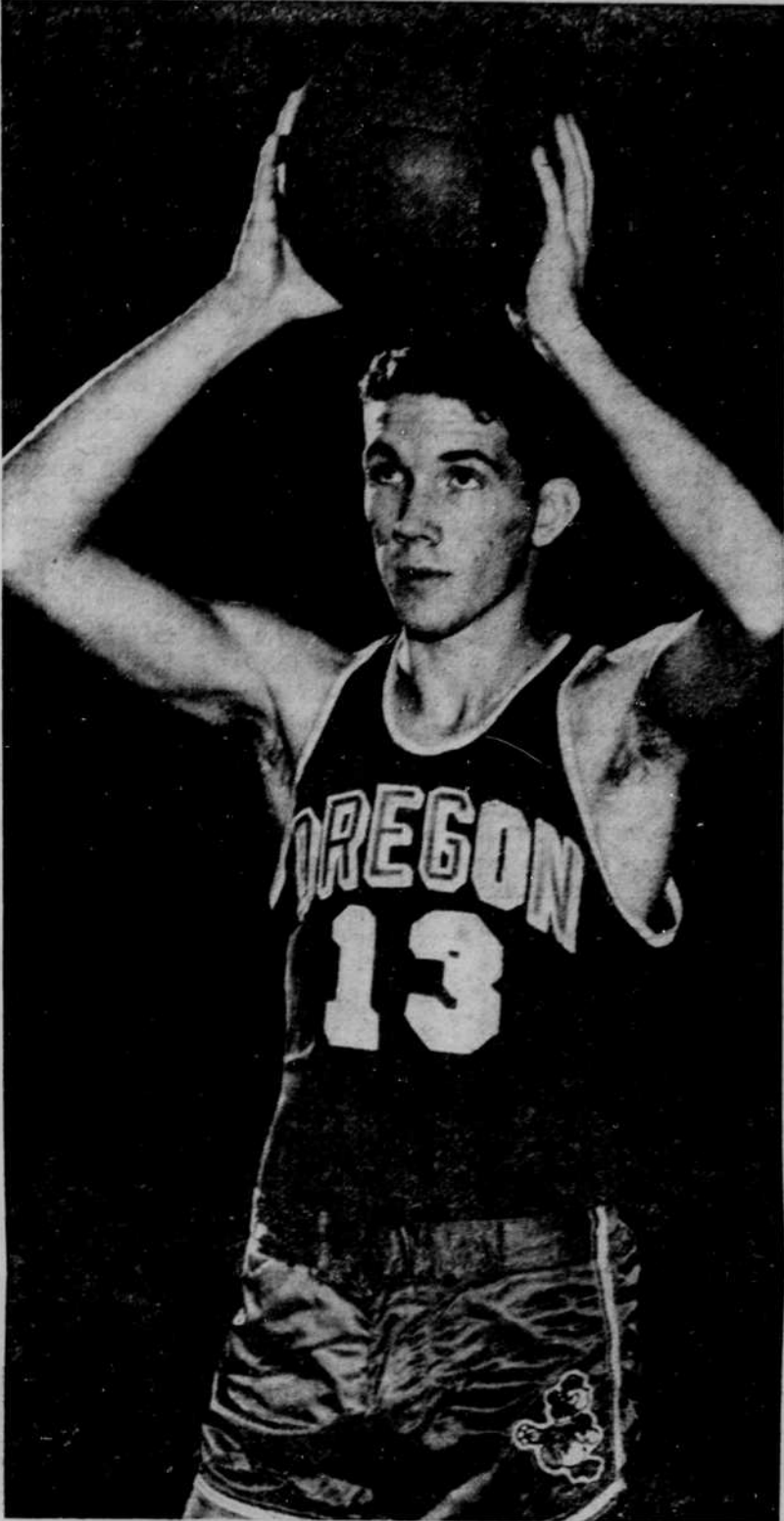
