

Three IM Clubs Grab Hoop Wins

Stafford A and Young A took one-sided victories and Pi Kappa Alpha won by forfeit in the only intramural basketball action yesterday.

Webfoot Keglers Bowl Saturday In Mail Contest

The University of Oregon bowling team will be out to retain their Northwest Intercollegiate Air Mail tourney crown, when they travel to Roseburg Friday for the 1957 match on Saturday at 4 p.m.

Last year the Ducks won the event by defeating the University of Washington by one pin, 2834 to 2833.

The tourney, different from others in that team results are compiled by air mail service, will draw ten teams including Linfield, Oregon State, Whitman, Idaho, Portland State, Washington, Washington State, and Stockton and Sierra colleges of northern California.

The members making the trip for Oregon are Don Lebold, Sam Sorenson, Champ Husted, Vern Jackson, and Bob Boyle on the first team, and Don Jacklin, Dick Neifert, Sam Morgan, Fred Pinjuv, and Mike Zimmerman on the second team.

This year Oregon will act as host for the tournament, receiving and compiling results of other schools.

Matmen Prepare For WSC Match

Coach Bill Hammer's twice-tried and twice-victorious varsity wrestling squad enters into their Pacific Coast Conference dual meet championship defense this weekend when they tangle with the Washington State College Cougar matmen at Pullman.

Undefeated in dual meet competition last year, the Duck grapplers are looking forward to another highly successful season, and barring injuries or other unforeseen accidents, should be able to wrap up another dual meet crown.

The WSC squad has long been a king-pin in coast wrestling circles, having brought home a number of coast championships in the last several years. The Cougars were beaten last week by the Oregon State squad, last year's coast champs, but this does not mean they can be counted out of the picture.

Fresh after two triumphs over Portland State and Lewis and Clark, the Duck grapplers should be in fine fettle for this conference opener.

Boasting experienced men in every weight except the 123-

pound class, where first year man Bob Stevens is coming along fast, the Ducks have as awesome a lineup as any squad on the coast.

With U.S. Olympic champ Lee Allen at 130, former PCC champ Dave Newland at 147, PCC champ George Krupicka at 167 (providing he recovers from an injury), and runner-up Ken Kesey at 177, the Webfoots can show as many titles as the next squad.

They also have dependable newcomers like J. D. Griffith, Dave Fish and Bob McCullough. Rounding off the squad are tried veterans such as Howard "Pepper" Timmons, Ken Karnes, and Jim Beaton.

The WSC match is the first of a three week gauntlet the Ducks have to face to start off the conference matches. The following weekend, the Webfoots tangle with OSC, and then grapple with the University of Washington, a newcomer to the coast wrestling ranks who will be trying the sport for the first time this year.

Coach Bill Hammer made no comment on the chances for success against WSC.

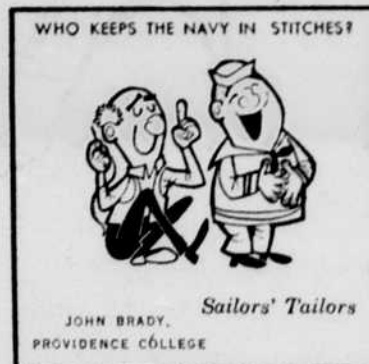
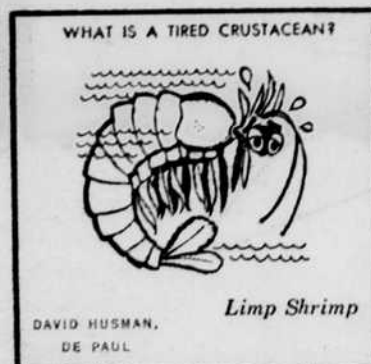
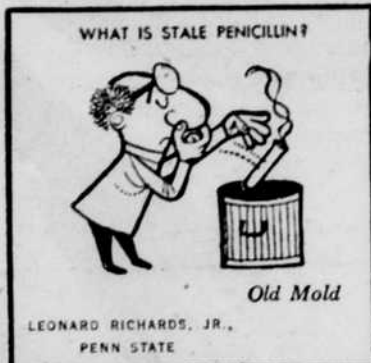
