

Ducks Drop 64-63 Thriller

Washington Squeaks Past As Franklin Collects 22

SEATTLE, (AP)—The Webfoots of Oregon almost thrust themselves an upset basketball victory over Washington Tuesday night, but time ran out and the Huskies salvaged a 64-63 decision in the non-conference tussle.

The game was an extra added to the schedule and does not count in conference standings. Four thousand people turned out, generally expecting to see Washington win in a romp. They saw, instead, a surprising Oregon team—victor in only one conference start so far—produce an amazing amount of "go" and just not quite enough "arrive."

The Webfoots trailed all the way after a brief flurry of lead swapping. Washington went in front at 16-15 midway in the first period and led, 38-30, at halftime.

The Huskies edged their margin up to 10 points right after the start of the second half and had to fight for their lives the rest of the route.

Charlie Franklin led the Oregon bustling, free-shooting attack with 22 points and Oregon held Washington's two scoring stars to just three field goals between them. A bucket full of free tosses helped Bruno Boin score 13 and Doug Smart 11, however.

Oregon outshot, outrebounded and outfouled the Huskies.

Staging a terrific shooting comeback in the second half, Oregon connected on 41 per cent of its shots in the second half after hitting only 28 per cent before intermission.

The Webfoots connected 26 times from the field, against Washington's 17, but they committed 22 fouls to 10 for Washington and lost two starters via the 5-foul route.

Center Hal Duffy bowed out with nearly 15 minutes left to play and there were nine minutes left when Eli Morgan followed him to the bench on personals.

It was a rough tussle and wound up looking like a couple of football teams. Washington was leading, 64-57, with three minutes to play when the Webfoots tossed aside all caution and went after the ball tooth and nail.

Six-Month Tour Due for Shaw

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP)—George Shaw, quarterback for the Baltimore Colts professional football team, said Tuesday he will leave next week for Ft. Benning, Ga., and a six-month tour of active duty with the infantry.

That will make the former University of Oregon great available to the Colts in mid-August. There had been some thought he would be called for two years of active duty.

Shaw said that like other reserve officers—he's a second lieutenant from his University of Oregon reserve training—he had the option of asking for a straight two years of active duty or of seeking a six-month stint followed by 7½ years of once-a-week meetings and summer encampments.

He said he chose the latter, "probably because of football," but added, "I want it clear I didn't ask for anything special. This was Uncle Sam's choice."

Sub center Paul Tucharadt looped home a hook shot from the key and Phil McHugh capped that by stealing the ball from the Huskies for a quick, long 2-pointer and the margin was down to three points.

Both sides had scoring opportunities in the next two minutes but muffed them in over-anxiety. Then with just 15 seconds left, Tucharadt jammed in another hook shot and Oregon was just one point back.

The Webfoots swarmed all over the Huskies, snatched the ball away and fired one desperation try out of a welter of players but the ball caromed off the rim and Smart cuddled it just as the gun sounded.

Oregon's defense came close to blanking Smart from the field. The Husky sophomore finally connected with a hook shot from the deep corner after 34 minutes of play.

Bruno Boin was unable to get his hook shot operating and hit only one field goal in each half.

It was long range gunning of the guards—mainly the substitutes—plus 39 free throw attempts which decided the issue again for Washington.
