A tour of the theatre and exhibits on the commercial and photographic angles of the theatre will be held at 4 p.m.

The Eugene Hotel will host the executive board banquet at 6 p.m., and a choice of two University Productions at 8:30 will conclude the first day.

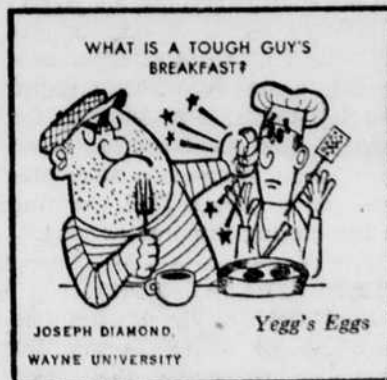
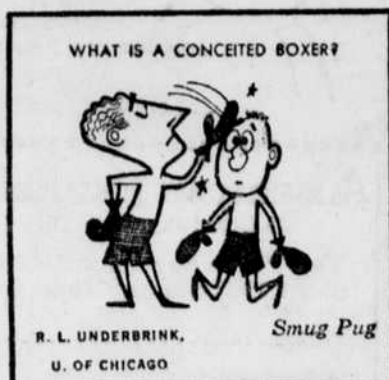
