

Student Review To Include Play, Original Music

"Gallows Hill," an original radio script by senior Gary Webber, will represent the speech arts at Tuesday night's Art Shoppe production, "Imagine That!" to be held in the Student Union ballroom at 8 p.m.

The play, a thirty-minute tale of horror in early America, will feature senior Cathy Newman in the leading role of Susan. Also listed on the program of the yearly review of original campus talent will be the "Original Suite for Brass Sextet" composed and conducted by Albert Gower, graduate in music. Gower's composition, written in three movements, Scherzo, Air, and Fugue, will be played by a sextet consisting of tuba, french horn, baritone, trombone and two trumpets.

A new aspect of art will be seen this year as the show highlights "Interpretation of Sports," an imitative-movement pantomime directed by junior Elaine Nissen.

Sponsored by the SU Creative Arts Committee, the free student-written, student-directed program will also include: an Afro-Cuban dance interpretation entitled "Dangers of Harvest," poems and short stories read by Barbara Du Pont, Carol Emmons, and Dave Frederickson; "Imagine That!," contemporary dance by Jenny Shen, two campus-produced movies and a piano solo, "Ballet in Three Movements" composed and played by Ron Spicer. The performance is open to the public.

Adviser Conferences Due for Spring Plans

Preliminary advising conferences for spring term will be held Monday at 7:30 p.m., according to Carlisle Moore, chairman of lower division advisers.

The conferences will be held for both upper and lower division students to enable them to save time when registering for classes at the beginning of spring term.

Time schedules are available today 8-12 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. in the registrar's office, Emerald Hall. Students may use the blank on the back of the booklet to fill out a tentative schedule before coming to the conference. Advisers will sign schedules at the conferences.

Lower division conferences will be held at the places indicated on page 2 of the time schedule.

Upper division students have been asked to see their adviser in his office during the scheduled time Monday evening.

If the winter term schedule is approximately the same as the fall schedule, it may be approved and signed at once by the adviser. These students will have an advantage on registration day, according to Moore, because they will not have to check with their adviser again unless a major change is needed.

Students who do not see their advisers on Monday evening must make an appointment to see him on registration day, according to Moore. The class schedule must be approved by the student's adviser before the student is permitted to register for classes.

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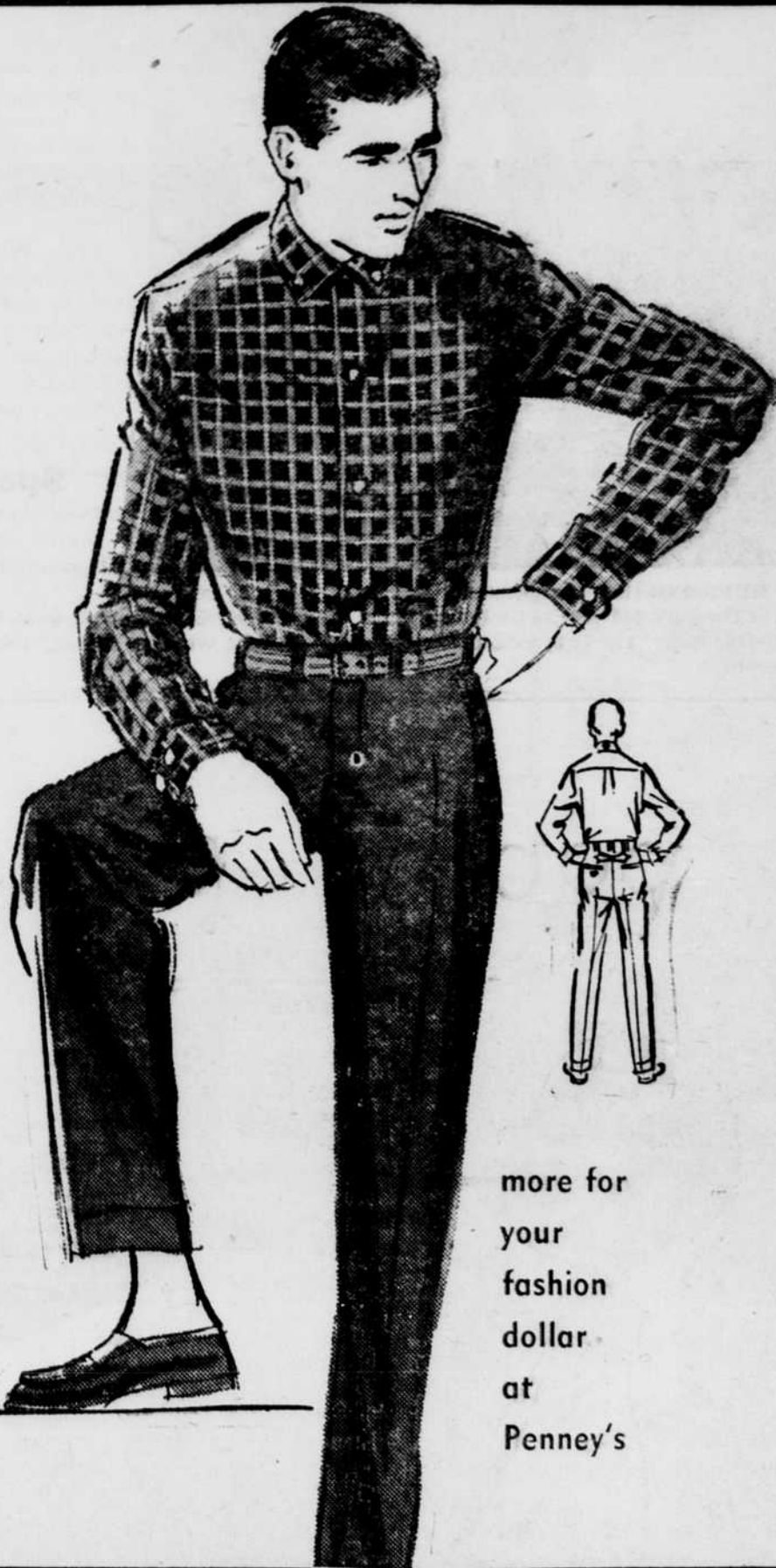
