

Model Assembly Votes Down USSR

A model session of the United Nations General Assembly was held Tuesday during the International Relations Club's final meeting of winter term.

Presented by the Senior Political Science Seminar in Problems of the United Nations, the session was concerned with the resolution that the UN take positive action against USSR violation of the UN Charter during the recent Hungarian revolution.

After individual debate by both sides, the resolution was passed 5 to 2. During the fiery debates preceding the vote, the entire Arab Bloc walked out after Syria's motion to reject the resolution from UN discussion was defeated.

A Belgian proposal for establishment of a special UN fund for economic development was carried 8 to 3, with the United States voting negatively.

The political science group is scheduled to participate in the Seventh Model United Nations on the Stanford campus beginning April 9. Sophomores Betsy Schwabe and Patty Swindells have been chosen to represent the Oregon group at the Denver IRC conference, April 2-6.

Elections of club officers will be held April 2 during the first meeting of spring term, which will be open to all interested students.

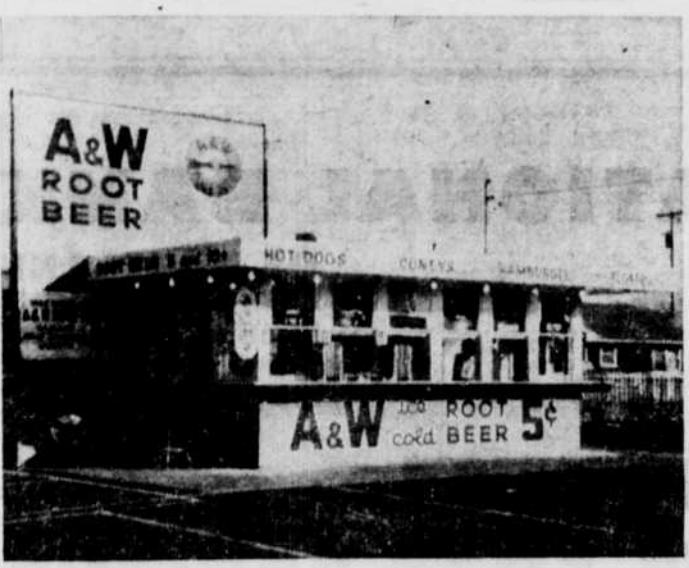
