The University of Oregon has entered three debate teams and several individual participants in the Linfield Speech Tournament which opened Thursday and will run today and Saturday.

Under the general topic of "Resolved: The United States Should Discontinue Direct Economic Aid to Foreign Nations," Oregon is represented by Shirley McLean and Donna DeVries in the Senior Women's division. Paul Ward and Leland Smith will make up the Junior Men's team and Gwen Samuelson has entered the Lincoln-Douglas debate.

"Problems in American Government" is the main topic of the extemporaneous division. Shirley McLean, Donna DeVries, Leland Smith and Gwen Samuelson have entered this division.

Last year Oregon won two first places in the women's debate and one first place in the impromptu division.

Lack of Capitol Halts Dorm Work

Construction on the new men's dormitory was halted Friday, March 1, because the contractors, Wall, Bartram and Sandford Construction Co. had insufficient capital, according to J. O. Lundstrom, University business manager. The company is attempting to gain new financial backing to finish the job which was scheduled to have three living units opened by fall term.

Lundstrom said University officials were disappointed by the delay, but that the University is protected from financial loss by a performance bond. If the construction company fails to finish the job, the bonding company will have to.

The new dormitory, called "Dormitory No. 2," will be given a name at either the April or June board meeting.
