rifled drawers and closets and in some instances attacked the men themselves.

"I didn't think I'd ever get out of there alive," one of the injured men recounted, "but what a way to go."

"I gave my all for the dorm that night, and I'd do it again," the student in the adjoining hospital bed commented. "Just give me a chance."

Driven out of the men's dorms unsatisfied, the mob milled around outside much of the night and picked off stragglers returning from local bistros.

Although some administration officials minimized the seriousness of the riot and attributed it to "the customary effect of spring," coed spokesmen later indicated that it set off the wave of unrest that has swept the campus.

Luckily I escaped this horrible fate and returned to bring you this stirring account.

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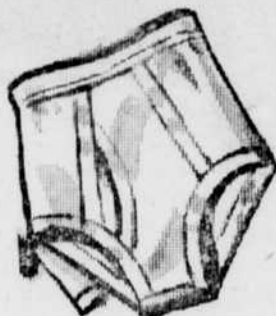


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
