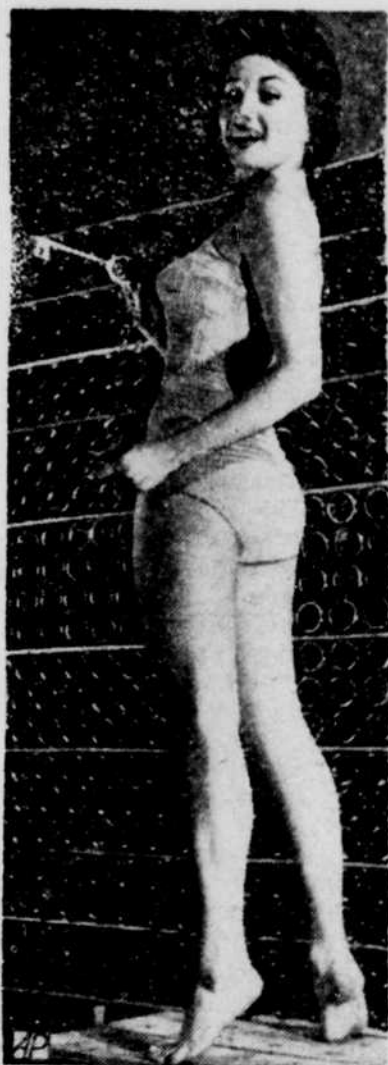

A crowd estimated at some 200 men swarmed into Emerald Hall early Monday morning, exhausting the registrar's supply of drop and add class cards.

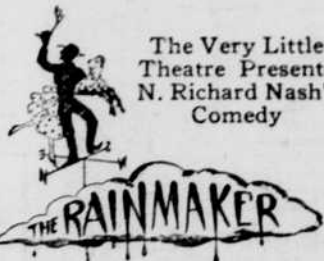
Informed sources in the administration suggested that the unexpected turnout may have been as a result of a new course opened in the architecture school—Still Life.
