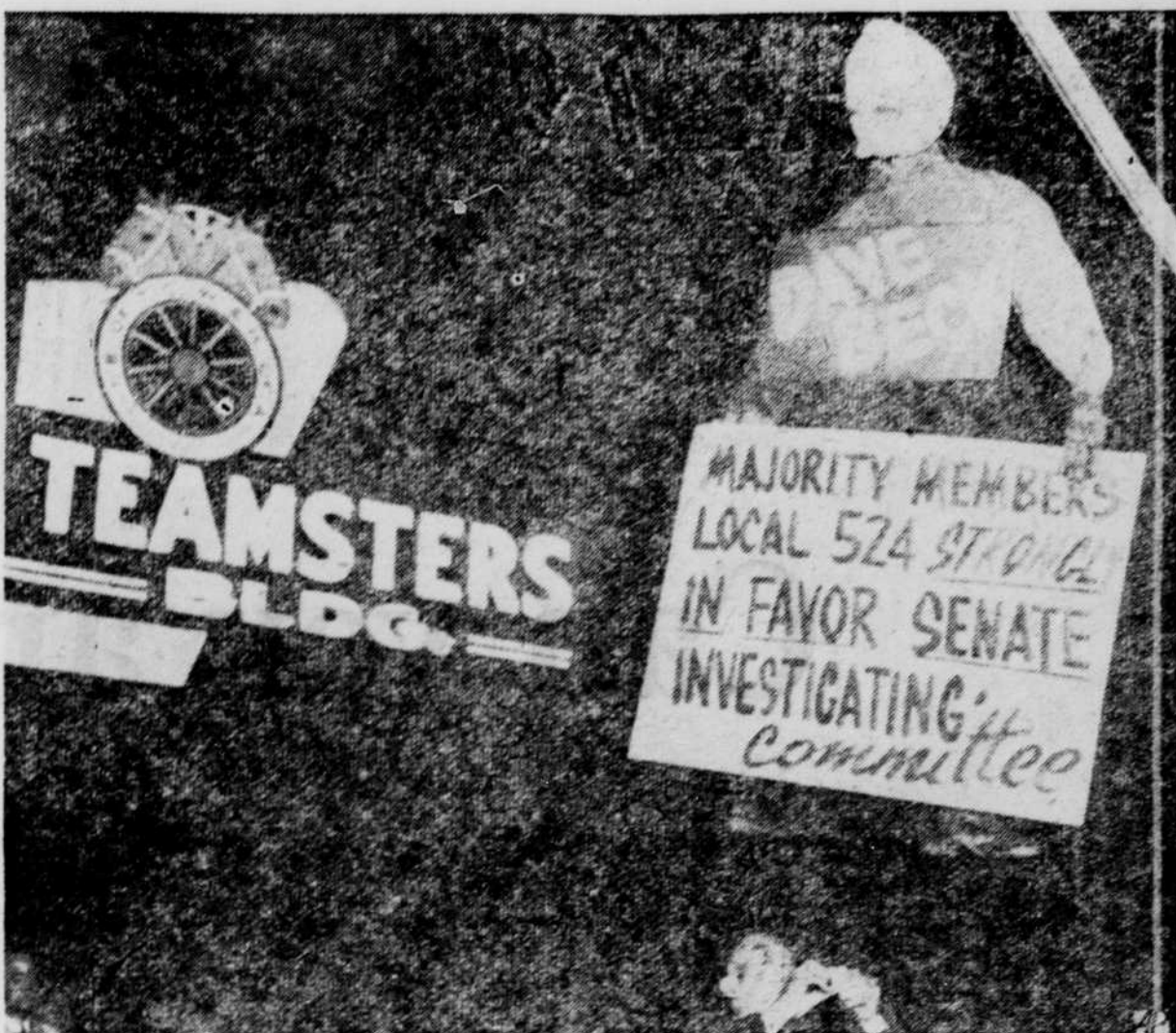
Dear Maxine:

Appointments may be arranged by calling the Student Employment Service, ext. 258.

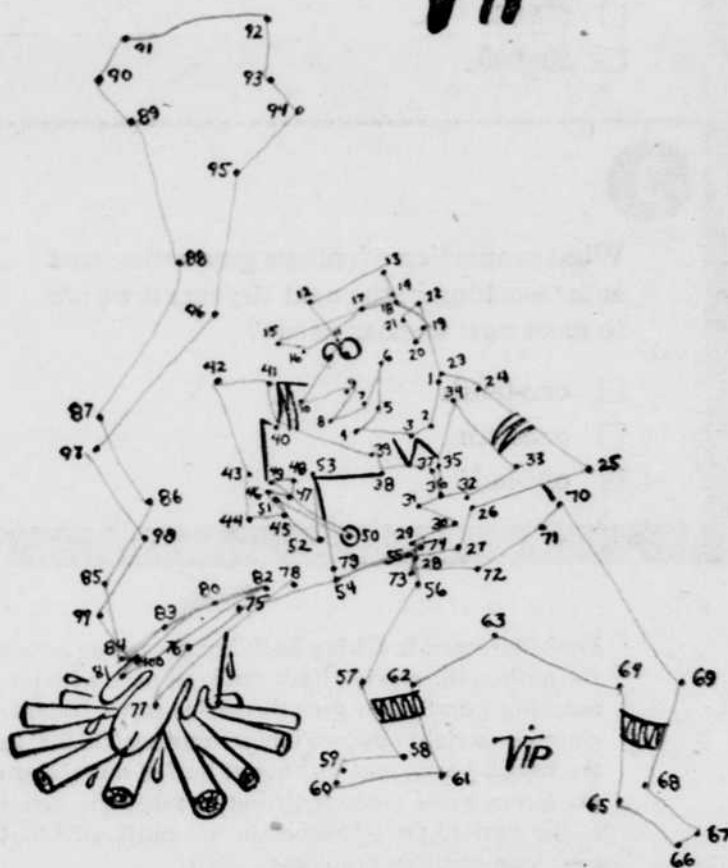
Positions open include jobs in the hotel and restaurant and as cave guides.
