A small crowd of Millrace enthusiasts were gathered around the tree when the news was received by Brittsan. Curious on-lookers had kept the lanky student body president company for most of the afternoon and evening.

Millrace restoration will cost upwards from \$40,000. The student share of this is \$10,000. About \$7000 had been contributed before the Millrace Day.

Since we may assume that neither the Registrar's office nor the office of student affairs

is engaged in medical research, their interests in a student's race and religion must be regarded with suspicion.

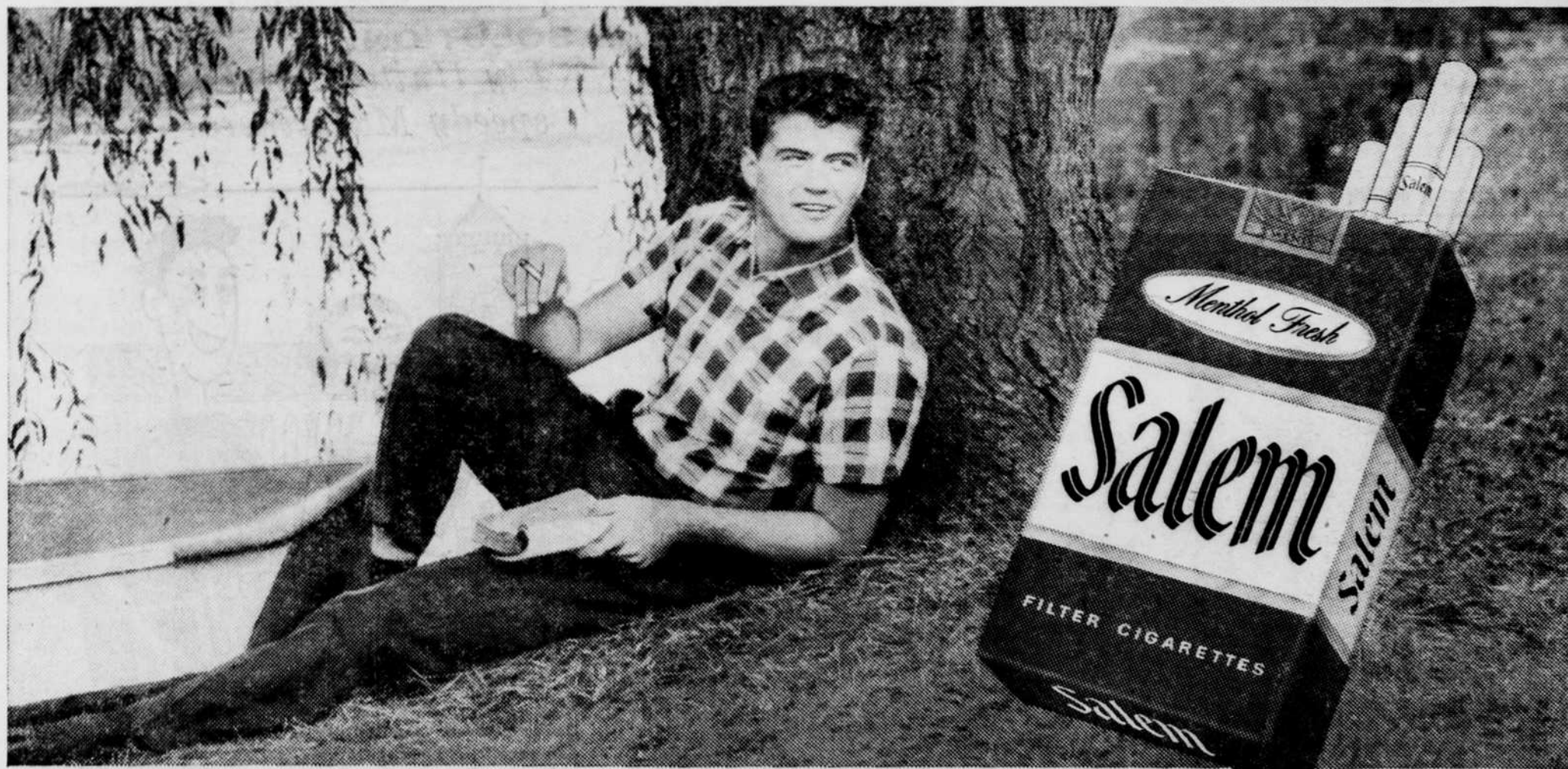
This and other practices should be investigated by the committee before turning to semi-independent organizations.
