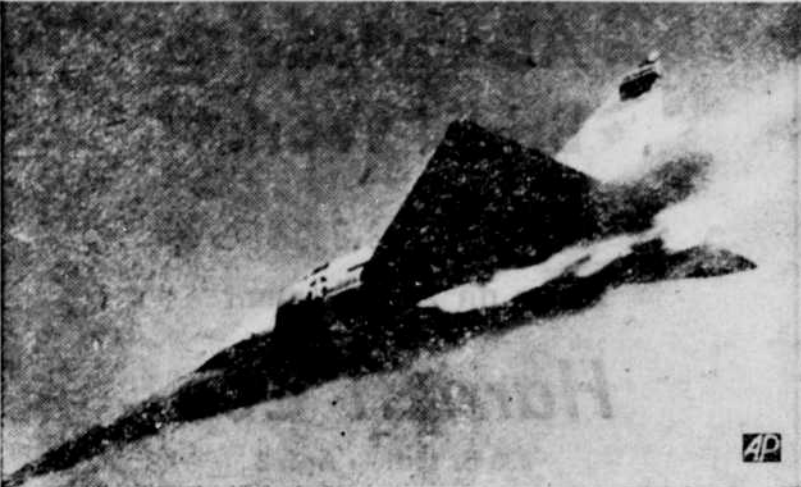
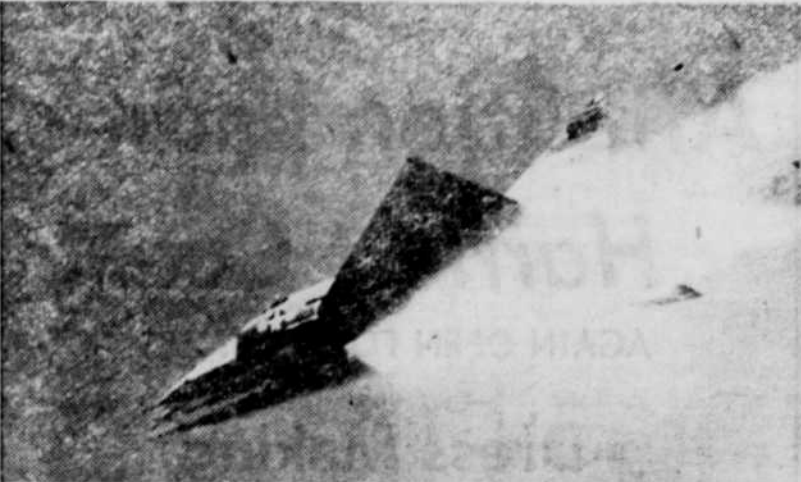

Sert to Lecture On Architecture

Jose Louis Sert, renowned personality of the architecture world, will be on campus for several days around the middle of October before going to Gearhart, where the National American Institute of Architects is meeting.

Mr. Sert will lecture to all interested persons on Tuesday, Oct. 15, according to Lisa Hunt, secretary-treasurer of the newly organized Students of Art and Architecture.

Sert, who was president of the International Congress of Modern Architects, is, at the present time, Professor of Architecture and Dean of the Harvard Graduate School of Design.

He has made extensive studies on city planning and has written several books on that subject. In addition, Mr. Sert has lectured at universities and colleges throughout the United States, including Harvard, Yale, M.I.T., Columbia, and Princeton universities.
