Zoo Director Stalks 20 Emperor Penguins For Oregon Zootopia

PORTLAND (AP)—Jack Marks today starts a trip he hopes will bring 20 Emperor Penguins back to the Portland Zoo.

Marks, the zoo director, said he will try to catch the penguins near a United States base in Antarctica.

If he is successful, they will be housed in a specially-built penguin house at the zoo here. Marks said the house probably will cost about \$50,000.

The structure, however, will need no special refrigeration to keep the penguins happy. Marks said the penguins probably can be kept cool enough just by spraying a fine mist over them.

Emperor penguins weigh about 95 pounds and are four feet tall when full grown. They will be flown here by the Military Air Transport Service.
