

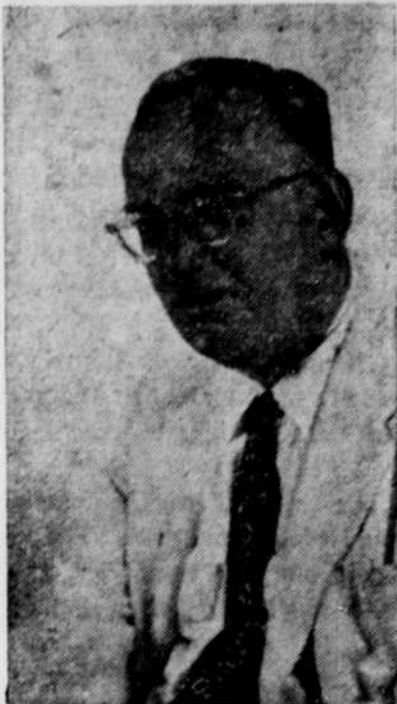
Gamow to Speak On the Universe

Dr. George Gamow, noted physicist from the University of Colorado, will deliver a Charter Day address entitled "The Origin and Evolution of the Universe" tonight at 8 o'clock in the Student Union ballroom.

Russian-born Gamow received his doctorate from the University

The physicist has worked in research laboratories for several government agencies, universities, and private organizations. He has served in the Bureau of Ordnance for the Department of the Navy, office of Naval Research, Air Force scientific advisory board, applied physics laboratory and operational research office at John Hopkins University, radiation laboratory of the University of California and Convair, San Diego, Calif.

Gamow is also a member of a number of scientific societies and holds the 1956 Kalinga Science Award.

Writes Books

In addition to teaching, Gamow is the author of a number of books and pamphlets. Among them are "Theory of the Atomic Nucleus," "Birth and Death of the Sun," and the "Biography of the Earth." The publications have been translated into 15 languages and braille.

Works for Government

Gamow has been awarded numerous fellowships from universities all over the world.
