An auction of 67 used, state-owned vehicles will be held Thursday on the premises of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, 9201 Southeast McLoughlin Blvd., Portland.

The 1947 to 1956 models include trucks, sedan deliveries, and passenger vehicles. The majority of the vehicles are from the State Motor Pool, Public Welfare Commission, Game Com-

mission, Industrial Accident Commission, and Oregon State College.

Auctioning will begin at 1 p.m. and each vehicle will be sold to the highest bidder. Successful bidders shall deposit 10 per cent of their total bid immediately and complete payment by Nov. 13, prior to the removal of the vehicle.

Vehicles may be inspected before the sale at the OLCC from 9 to 5 p.m. Nov. 5 and 6 and from 8 a.m. on Nov. 7, the day of the sale.
