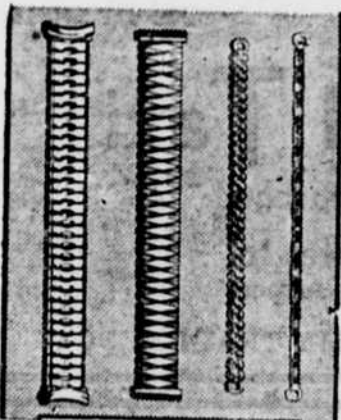

Faculty to Hear Jelinek Recital

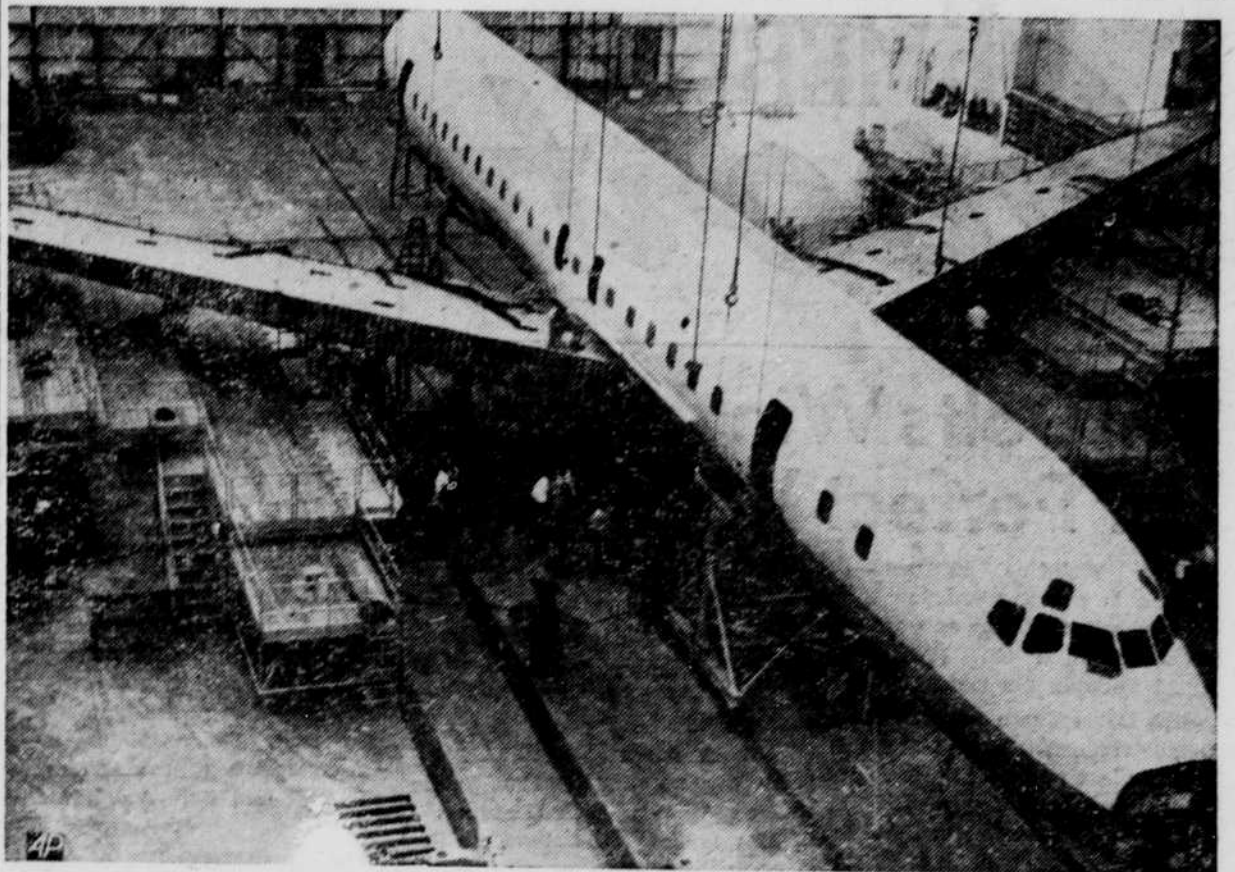
Jerome Jelinek, recently named professor of cello at the music school, will give his first faculty recital tonight at 8 p.m. in the School of Music auditorium.

Jelinek returned to the United States this past summer after studying a year in England under a Fulbright grant. He has performed in many cities both in England and Germany under the auspices of the U.S. Information Service.

He obtained his master's degree from the University of Michigan and has been honored by many awards and scholarships. He received the Regents Alumni Scholarship at Michigan in 1948-52, the Oliver Ditson award in 1951, and the Chamber Music Society of Ann Arbor Award in 1951.
