New among the relaxing blouses are the embroidered versions. Delicate or heavy embroidery patterns adorn fronts, travel down sleeves, or wind around collars and cuffs.

You'd be stunning during your leisure hours in one of these embroidered blouses combined with a pair of velveteen Capris. For a special touch, try adding a satin cumerbund . . . definitely feminine.
