Webfoots Travel South For Saturday Contest

Both Oregon and Southern California hope to bounce back from disappointing defeats when they clash Saturday afternoon in Los Angeles' mammoth Memorial Coliseum.

The Webfoots dropped a 13-6 decision to a fired-up Washington eleven, while the Trojans were pounded by Stanford 35-7.

The game shapes up as another crucial in the long line of stiff tests for the Ducks. A victory over the hapless Trojans would insure Oregon of a tie for the Pacific Coast Conference championship and an almost sure bid to the Rose Bowl.

USC hasn't been able to offer much resistance to opponents this year, their first under coach Don Clark. The Trojans have defeated only Washington and lost to six other teams.

But the Webfoots can't let down against the Trojans. Mistakes can defeat any team as was shown in Multnomah Stadium last weekend. "We weren't doing the blocking," Webfoot coach Len Casanova said Tuesday, "and we

Cleveland Selects General Manager

CLEVELAND (AP)—Frank Lane was hired as general manager of the Cleveland Indians Tuesday. He comes here from the St. Louis Cardinals, succeeds Hank Greenberg—and gets a three-year contract.

Lane, a 61-year-old jack-in-the-box whose player trades pulled the Chicago White Sox and St. Louis Cardinals higher in their league standings, still has a year to go on a three-year contract with the Cardinals. But his release there was expected to come from President August Busch.

Greenberg was notified by the club's directors Oct. 16 that his contract would not be renewed. Slumping attendance and criticism from the fans were factors in Greenberg's firing. A director, he controls about 19 per cent of the Tribe stock, and was present at Tuesday's meeting.

William O. Bill DeWitt of St. Louis, now in charge of a major league fund for the aid of the minors, originally had the inside track for the Tribe appointment.

made just about all the mistakes possible. Things happened that shouldn't have."

Casanova plans to stress blocking and tackling in drills this week in an effort to correct these mistakes that led to a Husky victory.

Comparative records don't give Oregon as much an advantage as might first be suspected. Both clubs scored twice against Washington State's 13 points — only Oregon made their extra points and the Trojans didn't.

Against Pittsburgh the Ducks lost by three points and USC lost by six. Only California and Stanford scores give the Webfoots a big edge.

Casanova thought Oregon's loss to Washington should help them against the Trojans.

"They'll be playing USC for the PCC Championship just as they played Washington," he said.

Casanova pointed out that USC's offense was comparable to Washington's with more variety. "They have a quarterback named Willie Wood—he's a junior college transfer—who is dangerous with both running and passing."

The players injured in the Washington game should be ready for Saturday's contest. Center Bob Peterson, end Ron Stover and halfback Charlie Tourville, who were shaken up in the Portland game, are all ready to return to action. Center Dave Fish had the cast removed from his hand and should be available Saturday also.

Ducks Dominate Season Statistics

Oregon continues to dominate game statistics over their opponents after the completion of eight games. Webfoot gridgers have amassed a total of 2350 yards in total offense as compared to 2080 for their opponents. Only areas where Ducks trail opponents are in yards gained passing and punting average. Oregon picked up considerably in yards gained passing Saturday as Webfoot passers connected for 195 yards, while the Huskies picked up 2 yards passing.

Oregon has made fewer mistakes than their opponents in the eight games played to date. Webfoot backs have fumbled eight times while losing the ball on just four of those occasions. Duck opponents, on the other hand, have fumbled 14 times and lost the ball eight times. Oregon has also committed fewer penalties than

their opponents and have not lost as much yardage through penalties as have their opponents.

Jim Shanley continues to lead individual rushing and team scoring. Shanley has gained 581 yards rushing and scored seven touchdowns for 42 points. Jack Morris is in second place in individual rushing with 386 yards on 82 carries and individual scoring with 32 points on two touchdowns, 11 PATD's and three field goals.
