

Music Students To Give Recital

Five students from the school of music are presenting a varied musical recital tonight at 8 p.m. in the music school's auditorium.

Clark Draws 'Moby Dick' Prototype

R. D. Clark, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts, spoke on "Edward Taylor: Prototype for Melville's Father Mapple" last night in the Browning Room series.

Clark explained that his main objective was not to compare Melville's Father Mapple, a character in "Moby Dick," with Edward Taylor, but to endeavor to draw a portrait of Taylor as a man.

He said that Taylor, a former sailor, served as pastor of the Seamen's Bethel in Boston about 1830. The Bethel was a joint en-

terprise of the Methodists and Unitarians, combining the religious zeal of the former with the financial practicality of the latter.

Taylor himself, in the words of Walt Whitman, was an "essentially perfect orator." He was like a captain speaking to his crew. Clark said that his worth as a preacher could be seen in the "attitudes and emotions of men, who hearing, gave themselves to him."

Clark defined rhetoric as composition of ideas and drama as composition of images. He said that Taylor had "a rhetoric that was essentially drama." He could be placed in the area where drama and rhetoric intermingled.

Father Mapple's sermon in "Moby Dick" concerning Jonah and the whale, Clark said, was the best literary representation of Taylor.

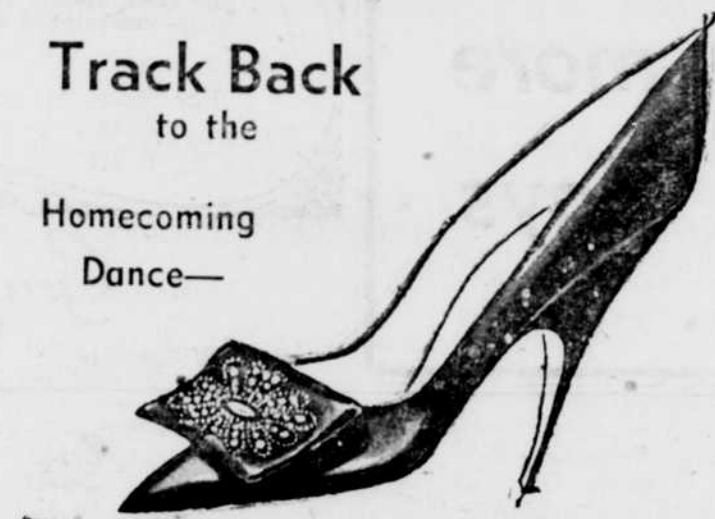

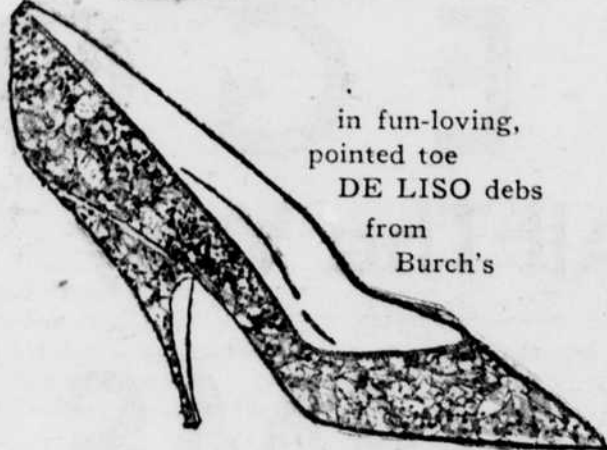
