ternal system within the University. It begs for pocket-pledging and hedging on the rules.

Further criticism could certainly be leveled against other aspects of the system, such as spending maximums and policing, but this becomes unnecessary once it is realized that this is a deferred pledging (legally) and not a deferred rushing system that is adequately enforced.

It would be possible to favor a true deferred rush program if its real benefits were not couched in false and misleading terms; if it didn't place a needlessly heavy burden on the individual fraternities; if the IFC could be relied upon to perform an adequate policing job with a maximum of friction; if summer rushing were a plausible part of the system; if it actually deferred nothing, and if its final outcome wouldn't result in a weakening of the fraternity system as a whole.

This plan and its ideology certainly don't meet these requirements.

Progressive Education Needed...

I say the first because college freshmen mainly have not learned, or been taught how to express themselves accurately and clearly. Result: A required freshman comp. class. In "skill" courses (math., languages) students are not grounded in the mechanics of the subject. Too, because of social pressures many find themselves in college, not knowing what to do—equipped only with an activityful background. In non-vocational and non-physical science courses, students lack, in President O. M. Wilson's words, "a hunger for knowledge." A recent article in Time magazine said of the college student: "Just as the goldfish swallower is dead, so, to a large extent is the dilettante and the knowledge-for-knowledge's-sake boy. Today's student has little patience with mere intellectual flash. Nor is he particularly tolerant of any form of obscurantism."

This overpowering concern with the actual, the concrete knowledge of the life situation, as opposed to theoretical inquiries, is, I think, the result of the new roles which the teenager plays today. He marries earlier; he travels widely and meets people, and mainly, he assumes adult responsibilities much earlier in his life than did his parents. He has to make decisions on his own, and as a result, he finds courses telling him how to handle finances, his family life, and his job directly relevant to his new responsibilities. In this sense, the liberal arts college is not prepared for the high school graduate.

Wilson and the University administration can, of course, boost the top students in the school through such programs as Sophomore Honors. Beyond this, however, they are subject to what the public demands in educational policies, and to the backgrounds and bents of the incoming freshmen.

Rear Admiral H. G. Rickover has just proposed a "Council of Scholars... to set a national standard for the high school diploma." This is a delicate and decisive proposal for it involves directly the public philosophy of education. It is also an issue to which we will have to address ourselves in the near future.

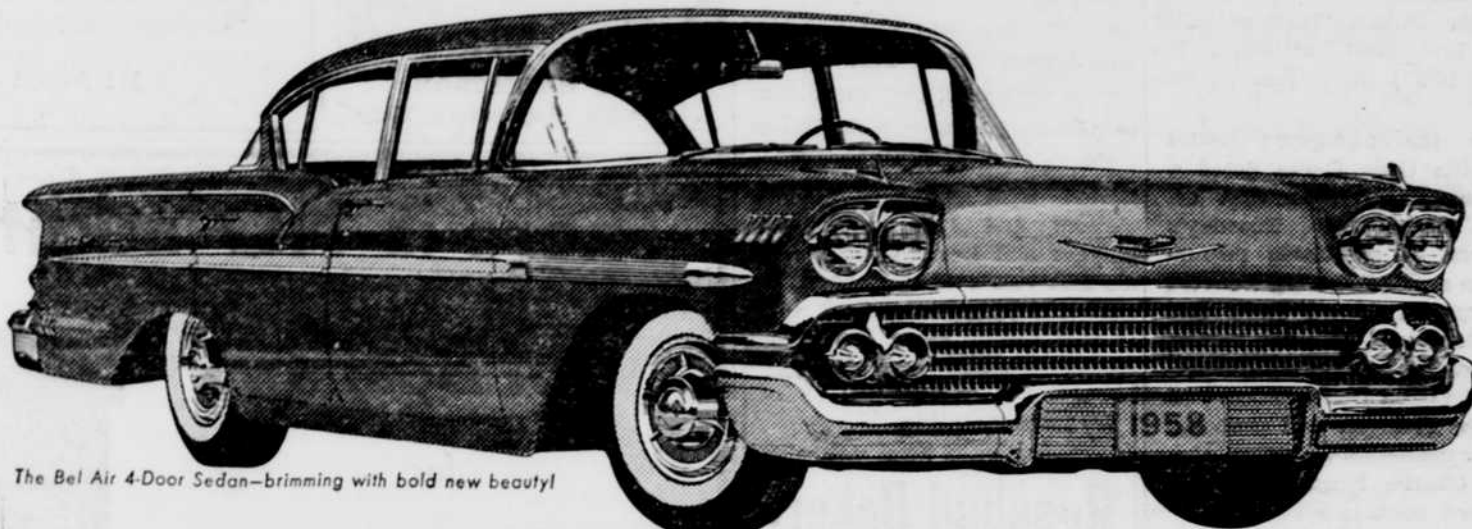

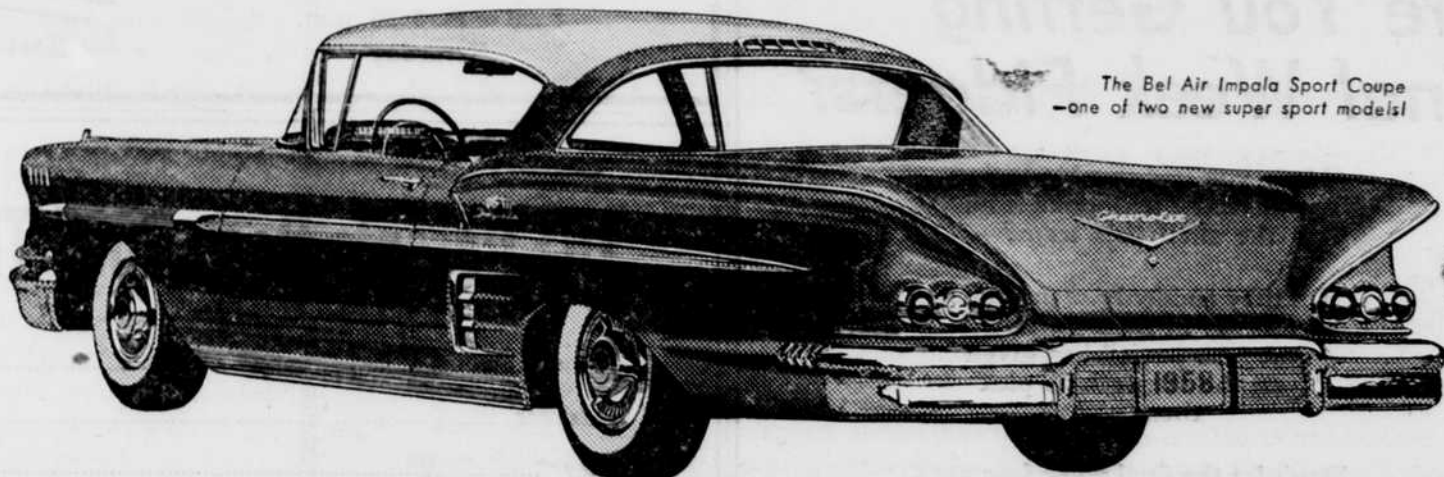
