

# Webfoots Seek End Of Big Ten Win Streak

New Year's day, 1958, will find the past season's top football teams battling in post-season games all over the nation. But the grand daddy of all the bowl games, the Rose Bowl, will take place in Pasadena, Cal., and will pit Oregon's Ducks against the heavily-favored Big Ten champions from Ohio State.

Back in Jan. 1, 1902 Stanford and Michigan inaugurated the Bowl before a comparatively small crowd. The Wolverines' Bill Heston, a speedy halfback from Grants Pass, Ore., led the team from Ann Arbor to a 49-0 trouncing over the outclassed Indians.

## Big Crowd in '17

Oregon made its first trip to the Pasadena in 1917 to meet a slightly favored Penn eleven. A crowd of 27,000, largest throng ever to see a football game on the West Coast up till then filed into the stadium to watch the two teams battle to a scoreless tie at halftime.

However, in the third period, tailback Shy Huntington broke loose for runs of 35 and 20 yards, then flipped a touchdown pass to all-American end Teg Tegert to give the Ducks the lead. Johnny Parsons boomed over from in close in the final period to give Hugo Bezdek's Webfoots a 14-0 win.

Oregon didn't wait long to return to the Bowl. The Ducks met a fired-up Harvard club in 1920 in the post-season test, and dropped a 7-6 decision to the Crimson Tide. (See elsewhere in this section for details.)

That was Oregon's last appearance in the classic, but worthy of interest to Webfoot fans is the game of '34.

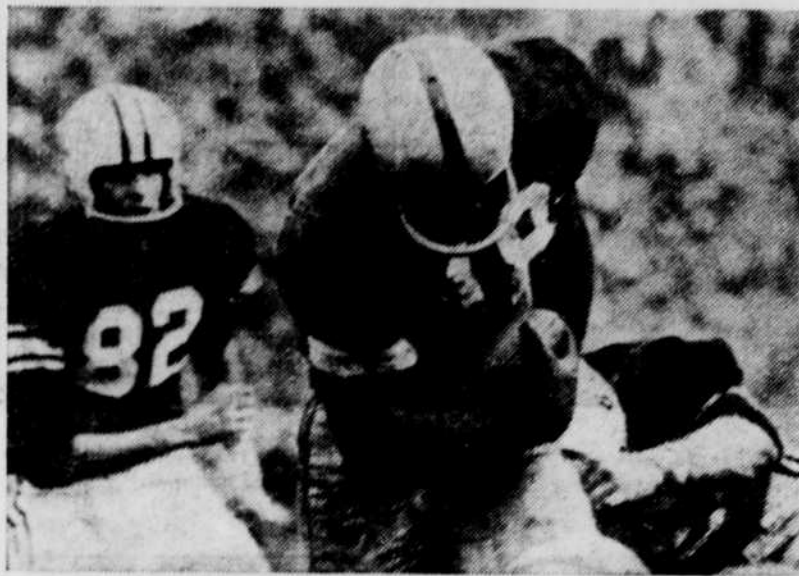
## Indians Were Underdogs, Too

Lou Little brought an underdog club from Columbia into Pasadena for a predicted massacre. His small team from the East was to meet the mighty Stanford Indians, led by all-American tailback Bobby Grayson.

"But the only trouble was," wrote the Associated Press, "the visitors did not know they had no chance."

Little's fired-up Columbians got a break early in the game when Cliff Montgomery sailed a long pass to Tony Matal, who went all the way to the Indian 17. Then, on the very next play, Al Barabas took the ball on a carefully practiced hidden ball play, and went into the end zone untouched. The Lions added the extra point and led 7-0.

Stanford charged back. Seven-

ral times the Indians drove inside the 15. Once they advanced to the three, where they had first and goal to go. But they failed to score, and when the game was over, Columbia had won, 7-0, for the biggest upset in Rose Bowl history.

## Lean PCC Years Since 1947

The present Rose Bowl pact between the Big Ten and PCC was started in 1947. Since that time a PCC club has won only once, USC beating Wisconsin, 7-0, in '53.

Last year it was the same old story. Tommy Prothro's OSC eleven fought hard, but early game jitters and Iowa running power turned back the Beavers, 35-19.

And what about 1957? It's not history yet, but on paper the game is easy to figure. Ohio State is the number-one-ranked team in the country. Len Casanova's Ducks are not listed in the top twenty; they will certainly be heavy underdogs.

But, on the other hand, no Oregon team has showed poorly in

the Bowl. And who can forget Columbia's Lions of 1934?

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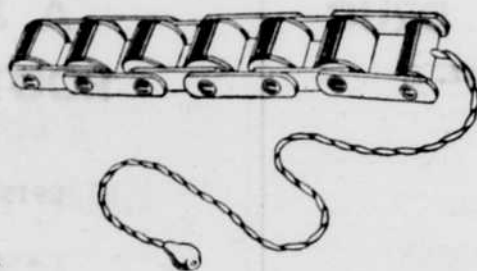
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
