• Rally Plans

Hours and hours of practice are being put in by the rally squads and the University band to provide spirit and entertainment at the Rose Bowl game.

Two new rally girls, Cindy Randall and Dottie Quinn, have been selected to fill out the women's squad, according to Dick Stables, yell king. They and the other girls have been practicing every night this week, perfecting specialty numbers for pre-game and time-out entertainment.

Miss Randall is a senior majoring in education. She is a member of Delta Gamma sorority and has taught ballet. Miss Quinn, Delta Delta Delta, is a junior. Both women have experience on former rally squads, said Stables.

Special Yell Featured

A feature of the game will be the special yell, "Oregon Sputnik, Boom," using 200 yellow and green beachballs waved to music and then thrown into the air at the end of the yell. These beachballs were used at the Stanford game and will take the place of a card section.

"We plan to concentrate on good spirit, lots of noise and cutting off the words in each yell for clearness, instead of introducing a lot of new yells," said Stables.

Band to Entertain

The 80-man, green-uniformed University band will share half-time entertainment chores with the Ohio State band. The University program will center around a show business theme, "That's Entertainment," including music from "Show Boat" and vaudeville.

A salute to the Oregon Centennial 1959 will close the program. There will also be a guest speaker on the Centennial during halftime.

Band members, directed by Ira Lee, will fly down Dec. 30 and return Jan. 2. They have been practicing since Thanksgiving and will be called back from Christmas vacation Dec. 28 for three days' extra practice.

Majorettes Doreen Morasch and Mary Jane Wait and Jim Walz, drum major, will also make the trip.

Assistant director of the band is Robert Cunningham and John Hendrickson of the UO audio visual department arranged the Rose Bowl halftime music.

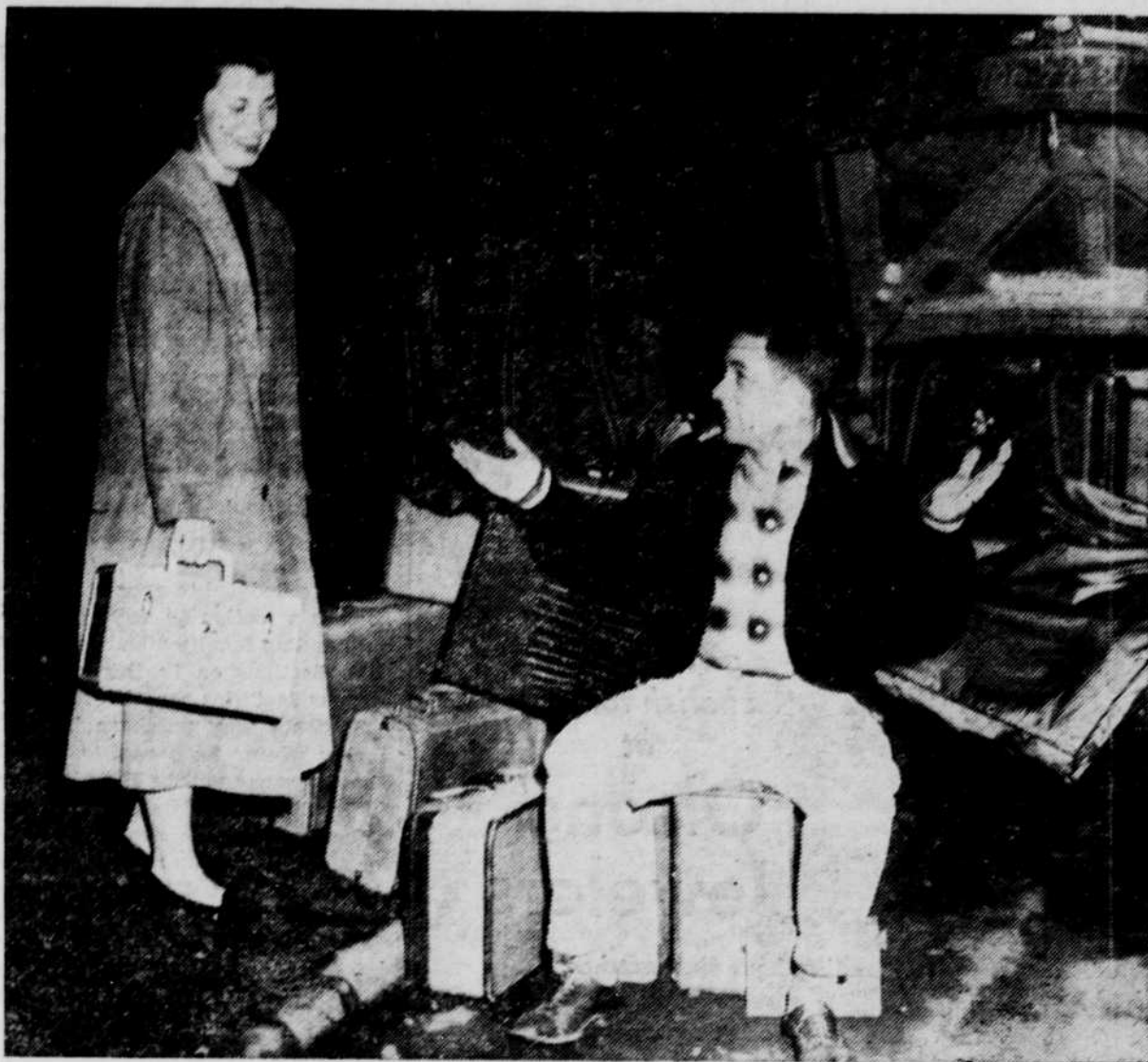
