

# Ducks Lose to Bruins, Trojans

## Belko's Hoopers Hit Cellar Following Twin LA Losses

Poor shooting accuracy from the floor led to a pair of losses for Oregon's Webfoot hoopers in their week-end series at Los Angeles's Pan Pacific Auditorium.

Friday night, UCLA built up a huge first half lead, then coasted the rest of the way for a 73-64 victory; on Saturday night Southern California took advantage of a weak-shooting Webfoot squad to post a 73-52 triumph.

The twin-defeats sent the Webfoots into the cellar of the Pacific Coast Conference, a position they finished the season with last season. Their PCC record now stands at 0-3; their season record is still a healthy 7-4.

Forward Charlie Franklin scored 28 points in the two-night

stand and teamed with center Hal Duffy in controlling the rebounds but it was not enough.

Against UCLA, Oregon connected on only 21 percent of its shots in the first half and the Webfoots didn't improve much against USC, hooping only 26 percent in a disastrous first half.

Idaho also made the trip to the Pan-Pacific and came out of the series with a split, defeating USC 81-65 on Friday night behind the 38 points of Gary Simmons and losing to UCLA on Saturday night 64-56.

The Trojans and the Bruins now hold down the two-three spots in the PCC hoop race. Southern Cal has a 4-1 record and UCLA has a 3-1 record. Oregon State, undefeated after two games, leads the conference race.

### UCLA 73, Oregon 64

The Bruins built up a huge 42-27 lead at halftime, mainly on the outside shooting of Ben Rogers and Denny Crum and the ineffective shooting of the Ducks.

Oregon came surging back in the second half behind the play of Franklin to close the gap to eight points 51-43 but the Bruins pulled away to ice the victory.

It was the second straight victory for the Bruins over the Ducks. Last week UCLA stopped a Webfoot rally to win 64-58 in the PCC opener for both clubs at McArthur Court.

A Webfoot zone defense at the opening of the second half halted the Bruin surge in the opening minutes of the second half but superb outside shooting by the Uclans finally paid off and Oregon could never get closer than eight points from the lead.

The Ducks improved their shooting eye in the second half and actually outscored the Uclans 37-31. Franklin and guard Bud Kuykendall led the surge, Franklin from under the basket and Kuykendall from the outside.

Oregon worked the ball well throughout the contest but couldn't hit when the opportunities were presented.

Franklin led the four Webfoot hoppers who scored in the double figures with 17 points. Kuykendall tallied 13; guard Chuck Rask added 12; and Duffy netted 11. Starting forward Dale Herron fouled out in the action-packed second half.

Guard Walt Torrence paced all scorers in the game with 17 points for the Bruins. Crum and Connie Burke scored 13 for the hosting victors.

### USC 73, Oregon 52

Bouncing back from a Friday night loss to Idaho, Southern Cal put on a white-hot shooting exhibition Saturday night to tame the Ducks 73-52.

Forrest Twogood's young but improving Trojans hit on a tremendous 52 percent of their shots while Oregon could do only half as good—26 per cent—in the first half.

The game was close only for the first three minutes, but with the score tied 3-3, Monte Gonzales streaked in for three successive layins to put the Trojans in the lead 9-3 and they were never headed thereafter.

Again Franklin and Duffy carried a big load leading the Webfoot scorers and rebounders. The one-two scoring combination combined for 18 consecutive points for the Ducks at one point in the first half.

Duffy topped Oregon in the scoring column with 12 points; Franklin followed closely with 11.

The youthful ball-hawking Trojans ran away with the game after leading 36-25 at halftime. Sophomore Jim White scored 19 points to lead the Troy; Gonzales followed with 14. Another second-year student Jim Hanna got 12 and used his 6-7 frame to great advantage on the boards.

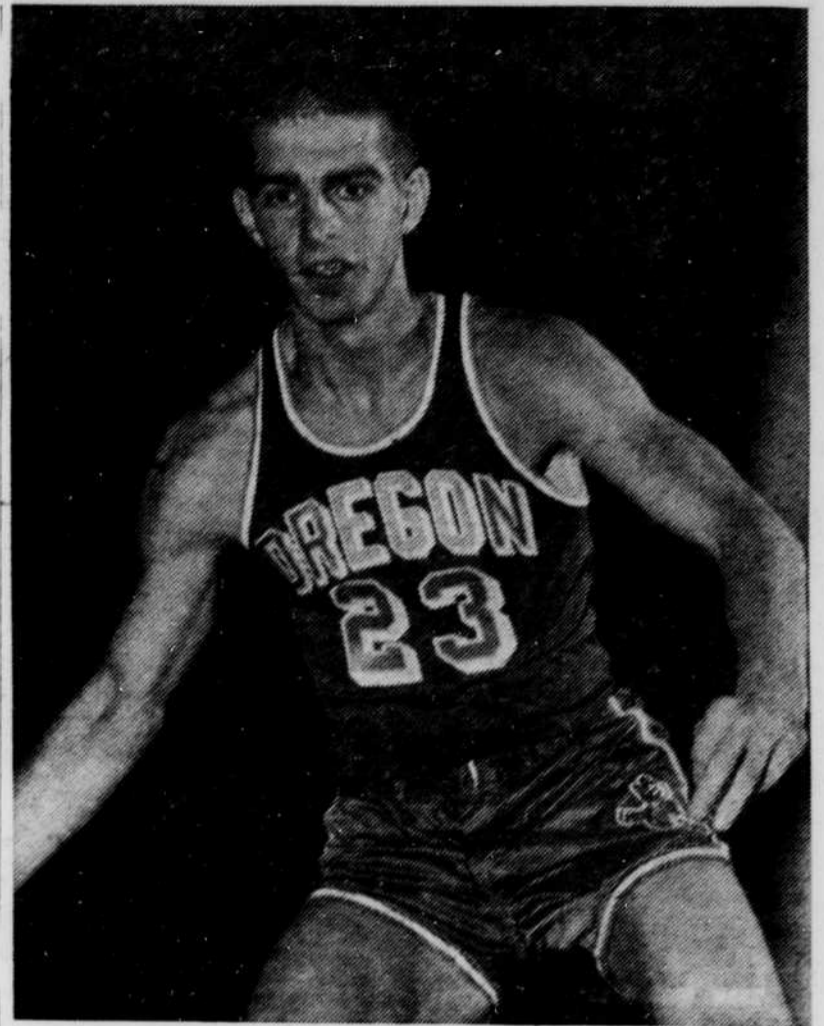
for a single-game against Washington's disappointing Huskies.
