The secretary and treasurer spots are open to girls in the sophomore class. The same grade requirements hold for these positions and for the offices of historian and editor, which are open to freshmen.

Most of the offices are self-explanatory, Miss Walcott commented, although freshmen may not be entirely clear on the duties of historian or editor. The historian is in charge of a bulletin board of AWS activities kept in the AWS office on the third floor of the Student Union. She also keeps the AWS scrapbook. The editor is in charge of all material written for the Emerald, the Register-Guard or other state papers. All the officers are members of the AWS cabinet and legislature.

All the petitions turned in will

be ready first by the senior members of the AWS legislature, according to Miss Walcott. On Feb. 3, the seniors will begin interviewing those who have petitioned.

After the interviews, a final slate will be made up and announced in the Emerald.

At noon on Feb. 11, those on the slate will be introduced at Gerlinger Annex to all interested women students. At that time, nominations from the floor may also be added to the slate. The election will be Feb. 12.

Newly elected officers will attend the state convention at Linfield College on Feb. 15.
