

Young, Alpha, NCC Gain Victories In Thursday's High Scoring Battles

Three more A teams entered the ranks of the victorious yesterday in intramural basketball action. Young Hall defeated McClure by a 39-28 score in the first action of the day. Following the Young-McClure battle was the game between Alpha Hall and Sheldon, which was won by Alpha, 39-12.

The final game of Thursday's basketball action found Northwest Christian College edging Barrister by a 33-25 count. All games played yesterday were in A competition and played on Court 40.

Young Triumphs

The quintet from Young Hall, led by center Larry Walker, joined the winners rank Thursday as they defeated McClure in a hard fought battle, 39-28.

The first quarter saw Young jump into a nine to two lead, as Walker and Willshire of Young set the pace. At the opening of the second stanza, the McClure attack, behind the sharp shooting of Coblens, Green and Todd came to life. With 45 seconds left in the half McClure gained the lead, 14-12.

It was a red-hot McClure team which controlled the play in the third period. The men from McClure dumped in seven baskets for 14 points while containing Young to three field goals for six points. McClure held the advantage until three minutes remained in the contest, but then Young caught fire and sank 12 points to clinch the game.

Young's six foot-four inch center Larry Walker took scoring honors with 18 and McClure's Ron Nakata netted eight points.

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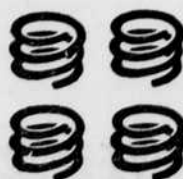
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Shanley Desires Pro Grid Career

Oregon's all-time leading ground gainer, Jim Shanley, declared that he is interested in a pro football career. Shanley made his intentions known in Portland Tuesday night while attending the March of Dimes Mardi Gras.

Shanley had returned earlier this week from the Senior Bowl game in Mobile, Ala., where he was a member of the winning North squad, which came out on top by a 15-13 score. Shanley was quite instrumental in the North's victory as he set up the winning touchdown and for the entire game he carried the ball 11 times and averaged 6.8 yards per carry.

The star halfback of Oregon's 1958 Rose Bowl team stated "If I think I can make it here with some club I'll give it a try, otherwise I will try for a spot with one of the Canadian teams."

Whether Shanley's wish to play pro football comes true will soon be known. The pros are scheduled to start drafting on Jan. 28.
