

DU, ATO Hoopers Nab Last-Second Triumphs

Tilt-Ending Shots By Coker, Nelson Sew Up IM Wins

Delta Upsilon and Alpha Tau Omega won last-second victories in Friday's Class A intramural basketball action. The DU squad edged Phi Gamma Delta 26-25 on a free throw by Jack Coker in the final second of play and ATO trimmed Sigma Chi 30-28 on a basket by George Nelson in the last five seconds.

Matmen Down Viks' Cougars

University of Oregon wrestlers proved they could come from behind in their last two meets, as they rallied to edge Portland State, 17-15 on Thursday, and beat WSC, 20-8 Saturday.

PSC, boasting an unusually strong group of little men, took the first three matches by pins to run up a 15-0 lead over the unbeaten Webfoots.

Duck veterans, going in the 147-pound class and above, however, took all the rest of the matches to pull out the two point win.

Only Oregon pin of the evening was in the 177-pound division

where Dave Fish, junior letterman who had to miss the football banquet in Portland because of his match, polished off Harold Erland after just 51 seconds of wrestling.

In the meet with the Cougars, the Webfoots again found themselves trailing at the end of two matches. WSC's Tom McCutcheon decisioned Gary Parks, 3-2, in the 123-pound class, and Cash Stone pinned Oregon's Gary Parks with 40 seconds of the third round gone.

Senior Ken Karnes, grappling in the 137-pound division, got the Ducks on their winning way with a 5-1 win over Jim Chapman, and Jack Roche's club didn't lose another match.

Once again one Duck pinned his man. Tough Jim Beaton put Tim Tiede's shoulders to the mat after 53 seconds were gone in the second round of their 157-pound clash.

Oregon's Frosh wrestlers also kept their unbeaten status by thumping the PSC Frosh, 24-8, in Thursday's preliminary to the varsity matches.

The Frosh will go into action next on Wednesday when they meet Grants Pass high in Grants Pass, and the varsity will rest until Friday when it faces California at McArthur court at 2:30 p.m.

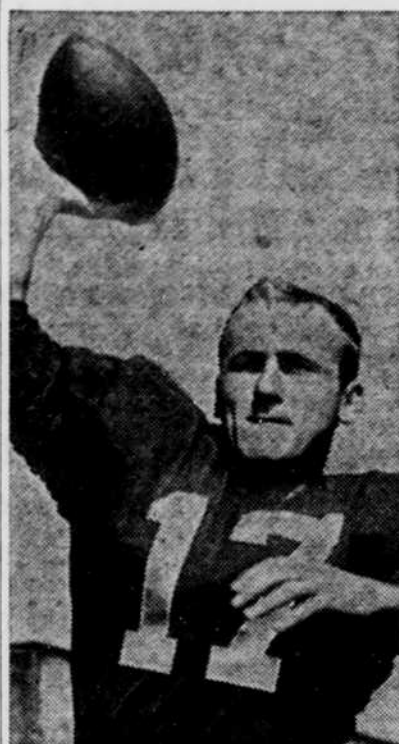

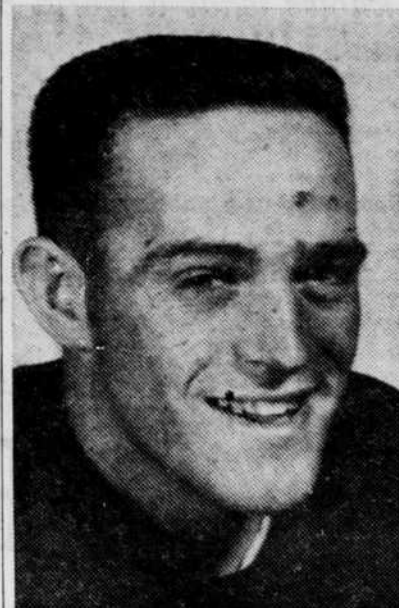
