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Generals Named State's Top Team

Grant of Portland, the only undefeated A-1 team in the state, climbed over South Eugene and took over the No. 1 position in the Associated Press poll.

Grant, which defeated two Portland League opponents last week, received first-place votes from seven of the 17 sports writers and sportscasters who took part in the poll.

Klamath Falls, fourth last week, took over the second place in the poll after two decisive victories over Crater of Central Point. Klamath Falls got four votes for first place.

South Eugene, which led the two previous polls toppled into third place after its 13-game winning streak was snapped Saturday night by Roseburg 46-37.

North Salem, fourth this week, got three votes for first place.

North Bend, fifth last week, retained that ranking after winning its two games in an invasion of Central Oregon.

Marshfield, No. 9 last week, advanced to sixth place, after beating Reedsport and Coquille.

Pendleton, with a 9-4 record, bobbed back into the top 10, after an absence last week. Pendleton is in seventh place. Astoria, 11-2, also came into the top 10 for the first time in eighth place.

Jefferson of Portland, tied last week with Roosevelt for sixth, was tied with Hermiston for ninth place this week. Hermiston was 10th last week.

Bowling Tourney Planned at Albany

ALBANY, Ore.—With an almost certain entry list of 1500 or more five-man teams, the eighth annual All-Coast bowling tournament will get underway at the spacious Albany Lanes here Feb. 15.

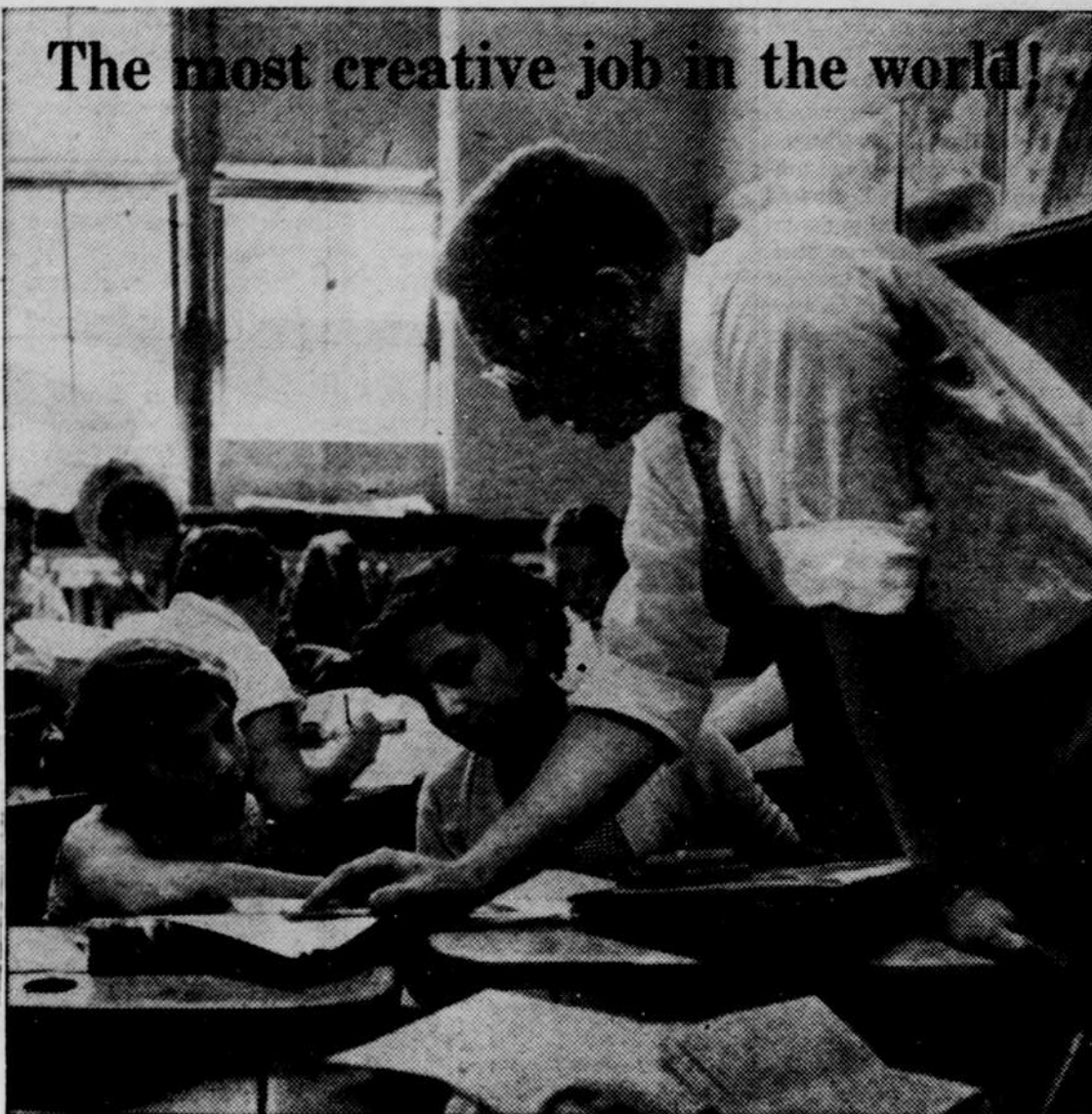
Tourney officials said today that all entries for the tournament must be in the mail no later than Sunday, Feb. 2, and urged that teams planning to enter do so on or before that day.

Already, more than 1,000 team reservations have been received from Alaska, Canada, Montana, Idaho, Nevada, Utah, Washington, California, and Oregon. Last year a record 1200 teams were entered and that mark is sure to be broken in good fashion. In fact, in all probability, the goal of 1500 set for this year will also be surpassed.

Prize money for this big bowling event, the largest west of Chicago, is expected to top \$100,000. Last year, a total of \$82,434.05 in prize money was awarded.

Toye Lindblad, operator of the Albany Lanes, today also urged prospective entrants to phone for reservations for bowling times, inasmuch as many choice times are already reserved. Lindblad may be reached at WAbash 6-2185.

The All-Coast will run for 20 weeks, ending June 29.



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
